Quiet chaos... It's the best way to describe this time of year. The competition circuit has gone dark! Flashy target rigs, bright colored shooter shirts and fat arrows have been hung up for safe keeping.

I would like to apologize to the Cherokee Bowhunters. Until this year, this club has hosted 3 Field shoots a year. There weren't any listed in the calendar this year, so I didn't include them as having any.

When I first started shooting there were 3 Shooting Styles. Freestyle, Barebow and Bowhunter in Open and Amateur, male and female. (Freestyle and Barebow in Youth and Young Adult, male and female.) That totaled 12 Championship awards in the adult styles, and 8 for the kids for a total of 20. Then after releases started appearing, the finger shooters wanted to be separated and Freestyle Limited was added in 1973. Over the next 39 years we have been sliced and diced into so many shooting styles and divisions that it has become hard to keep track of. We have went from 20 Championship Awards in 1970, to a whopping 72 possible in 2012. Luckily for the NFAA budget, only 50 of those were awarded this year. (Missouri awarded 9 Championship Belt Buckles for just 31 shooters.) During my research for this article, I found a list of the agenda items to be considered at the 2013 NFAA Convention in February. Two of them are on this very subject. One from Arizona, to recognize FSBH in all 3 of the youth divisions, and the other from Washington, to recognize all shooting styles in the Master Senior division which currently only has FS, FSL and BB. If these 2 agenda items are approved it will add another 18 possible awards to the mix, for a total of 90. Maybe next, we should separate the CAMO bows from the WHITE LIMB bows; after all, those white limbs must give you an unfair advantage, right? GIVE ME A BREAK !!!!!! The argument I hear the most is, "the NFAA doesn't have a place for me to shoot 'my' equipment or style". This seems to be the #1 argument used to get a new shooting style recognized by the NFAA. There is nothing that say's you must shoot a Compound bow, and 5 fixed pins in BHFS, or a scope and a long stabilizer in FS. You can shoot a Recurve or Longbow with 1 fixed pin if you want as long as your equipment, such as sights and/or stabilizers, fall within what is allowed for that style.

No wonder clubs won't host a field shot. Everyone got tired of going broke buying awards and the NFAA discusses this very thing at virtually every annual meeting. But the amount of shooting styles and divisions is only part of the problem facing the future of field archery. If you go to the NFAA website and look under history at the WAY BACK WHEN articles by Paul Davison, he says it very well. "SOMETHINGS GOT TO GIVE". To me the biggest mistake that the NFAA has made was in the early '70's, when they went to the currently used FLIGHT SYSTEM. All of you know how it works. Everyone is put in their shooting styles and after the competition, is over, if there are enough shooters, or the scores are extremely different, we draw a line somewhere on the results, and that becomes second flight. Then those in second flight get their "token" awards. The reason I call them token awards is because if 2 or 3 more people show up, the break would be in a different place, and the person who was first in that flight would now become last in the Championship flight. And with 2 or 3 less we have a different "winner" in second flight, stopped going to the State, Sectional and National Tournaments. I say most because, there will always be those who want to experience going, at least once, and those who have been shooting for what seems like forever, like me, and are as obsessed with competing in Field Archery as I am.

Before the current Flight System, there was the Class System. The word Class sounds politically incorrect but get over it; it is only a word in this case and can be any word you want, so lets call it a different type of flight system. I know many of you say we shouldn't go backwards, but I say, why not? Most of the current field archers are not old enough to remember it so to them it would be brand new. Is what we are doing now working so great? At least hear me out. Only a few of you even remember how it worked so I will give you a brief explanation. You were put into "A", "B" or "C" flight, according to scores previously shot and recorded on your NFAA Handicap card. What is that you ask? Well, every year, when you join the NFAA you are sent a card that is 3.75"x8.5" and has columns on it for you to enter your field and/or hunter round scores. (Some States issued a substitute for this to their non-NFAA members, for use at non-NFAA sanctioned tournaments only.) You can shot those scores at your own club or at a tournament and have them verified by an official. Then when at a tournament you would show this card to the host and be put in with other shooters who shoot a similar range of scores, and you competed against them. If "B" flight was say at 520 points and under, and your previous scores were 510, 506 and 495, you would compete for awards in "B" flight. If you won in "B" against your peers, wouldn't you be more proud of that than the "token" you "might" get now? Once you shot 2 scores in "A" then you would be in "A" flight. That alone was a badge of pride. If you didn't have any scores on your handicap card, then you were automatically in "A" flight until you had a minimum of 2 scores. The Champion in each shooting style would still be the top scorer, so you could end up The Champion if you shot the top score in that style. I can hear my opponents now saying that it would be possible for three shooters to show up and 1 each be in A,B and C. Well yea, but only one can win the championship in that Style, the others would win metals as it is now. The only difference would be that they would both be Gold instead of Silver and Bronze. The cost of these medals is only \$5.00 each from the NFAA. The other argument is sandbagging. Well if you don't think that is a problem now with our current system, then you are living in Lala Land! Plus, it was easier to recognize, now much harder.

The next thing that would need to be done is to consolidate as many of the shooting styles as possible. At the 2012 NFAA National Field Championships there were 50 shooting styles/divisions represented; 21 that only had 1 or 2 shooters, 7 more that had 3 or 4. Merging some of them could be done and make a minimum of shooters angry, but if they truly love field archery, they will make the adjustment. I have mixed feelings about what to do with Master Senior and Senior because they made up over 46% of the shooters at this years Nationals, the Adult and Pro's only 45%. As long as they are offered I will compete in the Master Senior division. However, even though I can no longer beat the youngsters, if we had a preflighted system and eliminated the Senior divisions, I would be happy to compete wherever that would put me. I would rather end up in the bottom of "A" flight, where I have almost no chance of winning, than to not have Field Archery, because we let it die. I know a lot of Seniors are starting to steam about now, but if I am not willing to sacrifice, how can I ask anyone else to.` I told you I would be stepping on some toes.

CONSERVATION COMMITTEE

Are there Mountain Lions in Missouri? The answer is **yes** and there seem to be more every year. 22 confirmed reports of sightings, photos or other evidence in the last three years.

Shannon Co. leads with 5 confirmed. Two reports in September of 2012 by game cameras.

Reynolds Co. with 3 confirmed. In January of 2012 a private landowner caught a live male mountain lion in a large cage trap. The MDC Mountain Lion Response Team collected DNA samples and determined the animal was about two years old with no signs of having been held in captivity. It was released back into the wild after the samples were collected.

Grundy, Oregon, & Macon Counties with 2 reports each. The latest in April of 2012 by a game camera. The counties of Wayne, Texas, Carter, Gasconade, St. Louis, Ray, Linn, & Platte all had 1 confirmed report. The latest was in Wayne Co. in September of 2011. A photograph of a paw print in mud was taken by MDC staff and verified to be that of a mountain lion by the Mountain Lion Response Team. The Department of Conservation wants to learn about mountain lions in Missouri and encourages you to report sightings. We have established a Mountain Lion Response Team (MLRT) and given special training to our wildlife damage biologists and selected staff to prepare them to deal with mountain lion incidents.

Tracks that are characteristic of a mountain lion should be photographed and then covered with a bucket. Photos, plaster casts of tracks and other physical evidence such as hair or scat should be sent to the Conservation Department so that experts can examine them.
