Cole Duensing Awarded MBH Paul Jeffries Scholarship

With a crowd estimated in excess of 300 competitors and guests, Cole Duensing of Clinton, Missouri was recognized as the 2010 winner of the MBH Paul Jeffries Memorial Scholarship. This ceremony took place after the morning line on Sunday during the 2011 MBH Indoor State Championships.

Cole will be attending State Fair College after graduation this spring from Clinton High School. He plans to pursue a degree in the outdoors including Wildlife Management and related fields of study. A glowing statement from one of Cole's teachers was read at the proceedings by Dick Wood, who has spearheaded the Scholarship program since he inducted Paul and Earl as the first members of the MBH Hall of Fame.



Not only is Cole an excellent student, but he is a very active MBH member. He competes indoors and outdoors, is an ardent bowhunter, has taken a 150+ class buck, helps coach youngsters in the MoNASP program, and is a frequent contributor of articles in the RELEASE. Cole

is known as the type of person that gives back more than he takes from any organization.

Family members of Paul Jeffries on hand to meet and congratulate Cole, were sons Dennis and Mike Jeffries, and grandson Aaron, who like Paul, works for the Missouri Department of Conservation.

Aaron later commented on the presentation with these remarks, "We're very happy for Cole and his family. Archery and bow hunting were important to my grandfather. He worked tirelessly to advance archery and bow hunting in Missouri. It is amazing to see how bow hunting and archery have grown in Missouri the last 60 years. We wish Cole the very best in his pursuit of a fisheries and wildlife degree."

All MBH members should be aware that Paul and Earl Hoyt are credited with founding Missouri Bow Hunters in 1947. Both of these pioneers in archery were responsible for the first Archery deer season in Missouri in 1946.

Wood took time at the ceremony to challenge every MBH Club to have an annual fund raiser and contribute a minimum of \$100 year to this worthwhile Scholarship fund.



LARGE & SMALL GAME COMMITTEE

As promised, a summary of the past deer & turkey season by our members will be part of this month's article.

Ninety one deer reports by 84 members, with seven members killing two deer were filed. Nineteen fall turkey reports were reported. Well, that was back in 1985. In my file of MBH game reports that is the first year that I have on record. Since then, things have changed. I pulled other files, and in the late 80's, there were several years when there had been as many as 129 reports turned in. Considering this is when one could only kill two deer on an archery permit, plus one on a firearm permit, these numbers were very impressive. When I took this committee over some 18 years ago, my goal was to achieve 100 deer reports. The number of reports have steadily declined. For the 2009/10 season my goal was to have 50 reports. There were 52 reports. The 2010/11 season came up short by 4 reports, with only 46.



As in the past, a summary of the season as stated. There were 46 reports turned in, excluding myself, only 17 members out of several hundred MBH'ers took the time to file a deer report. Four members reported a single deer kill, five members killed two, four members killed three white-tails and five killed a total of four. This year was not the time to sleep in, for thirty of the deer were taken in the A.M. and only 16 in the P.M. Last year ther were 27 in the am and 25 in the pm.

Of the deer taken, 31 were does, only four button bucks, and ten antlered bucks, three of which qualified as P&Y typical. Of the anterlered bucks killed ,eight were taken in am and only two in the pm. Carbon arrows have made their place in the bow hunting world. Last season we had 40 carbon, ten aluminum and only two cedar. This year we had forty carbon and only five aluminum. Last season we had 47 reports of fixed broadheads and only five of mechanicals. This year there were 35 reports of fixed and eleven of mechanicals. The average shot placement is still under 20 yards. Last year, the average was 18.3 yards. This year it was 18.6 yards with only five hunters taking shots over thirty yards and five hunters taking deer at ten yards or less. While 38 of the deer were taken from tree stands, one was taken by stalking, three by still hunting and four by the aid of a blind.

The age of the hunter is still up there. Last year the average age, of the reports turned in, was 59.7. This year it was 55, with the youngest member being 36 y.o.a. and seven of the eighteen reports being sixty or older. This is the second year in a row where there was not an entry for 1st Deer Youth Div. (sixteen or younger reporting a deer kill)

Several years ago, at the Columbia Deer Classic, in talking to selected MBH members, they expressed that due to physical limitations, they have resorted to a cross bow and because of the type of weapon, didn't feel that they should qualify to make a deer/ turkey report. The numbers were so that I felt a special award should presented for those members. Three years ago, I started a 1st Deer-Cross Bow Div. To this date, one member has reaped the benefits of this award. For he is the only one to enter. Although he has not told me, I'm sure he is somewhat happy that no other members have filed, for he is filling his wall with plaques and his fanny pack with some prestige's hunting knives.

The 2010 spring turkey season, had one member killing two toms. Both were killed with mechanical broad heads, from a blind. the average shot was 23 yards. In 2009, there were six birds killed.

For the 2009/10 fall season, we had 17 turkey reports. The 2010/11 season had five members report 11 birds. Four shot two and one member killed three. There were six hens and five toms reported. Seven were taken in the am and four in the pm. The average shot was 19.54 yards with the furthest at 31 yards and the closest at 5 yards. Seven birds were taken by fixed broad heads and four by mechanical. While seven members used blinds to harvest their kills, three members still hunted , while one stalked his prey.

As in the past, I would like to thank those members that took the time to fill out the report form. If one has been following my articles, can't help but notice the same successful hunters appear year after year and many of those names were in the 1985 file. It would be nice to see more new names.

Don't forget to report that Spring turkey. The deadline is June 10th. One can receive a game form from the MBH web site or give me a call & I'll send you one.

The Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) estimates between archery permit sales and land owner permits, Missouri has approximately 150,000 bowhunters. Yet, LESS than 1% belong to either state wide archery organizations, that being Missouri Bow Hunter or United Bow Hunters of Missouri. Just thought you'd like to know! til then, Jack

Missouri Bow Hunters Hall of Fame

Many of our members are not aware that the MBH has a Hall of Fame. The ideal of a Hall

of Fame was presented to the Board of Representatives at one of the state outdoor championships by Dick Wood. His goal and ours to this day is to have a place to showcase and honor the MBH Hall of Fame inductees.

Past recipients have been Paul Jeffries (co-founder of MBH), Earl Hoyt (co-founder of MBH), Ann Hoyt and Gene Towne. At the 2011 State indoor Championships two more members were inducted into the hall of Fame. The new inductee's are Earl and Millie Foster.

So, what is the criteria for consideration and how is one elected into the Hall of Fame. The Hall of Fame was formed to honor those MBH individuals who exhibited by their deeds, leadership and effect on archery in any or all of its forms that makes them stand out among their peers. The inductee into MBH Hall of Fame must be an MBH for at least 10 years. The Hall of Fame Committee is made up of the Chairman and all lifetime members. The committee submits names for consideration to the Board of Representatives at the January meeting and they are voted on at that time by the Board.

If you know of some one whom you think deserves this recognition any MBH member may be a sponsor. As a sponsor you will need to submit a name of the individual along with a detailed resume to the Chairman or one of the lifetime members. All nominations will be held in the strictest confidence of the committee and will be presented to the Board of Representatives at the January Board meeting and voted on. The results of the vote will not be given out except to notify the sponsor if the individual has or has not been elected.

Inductee's will be officially inducted into the Hall of Fame at the State Indoor Championships. Photos, along with an article will be published in the MBH Release.

Last month I reported from the Conservation Federation of Missouri's annual convention, the defeat of the resolution to allow crossbows during the normal archery season. This month I will share information that I learned from the CFM convention. During the Saturday meetings Missouri Department of Conservation wild-life biologist Lonnie Hansen talked about the Elk restoration project for Missouri. I am sure you probably have already heard it is going well so far. The first Elk release will happen this May. Around 40 Elk will be released this year. The MDC hopes to eventually release about 200 and expects the herd to grow to about 500 animals. The MDC will manage the herd through hunting and expects hunting to happen sooner than later. Hunting Elk in Missouri will probably happen within the next 5 years!

We also discussed the Black Bear in Missouri and the project MDC biologist Jeff Berringer is conducting on the population. A hunting season for Bear in Missouri may also not be far away. Some may think my enthusiasm for new hunting opportunities in Missouri is only to add to the animals I have killed. While true that I would be proud to add Missouri Elk and Bear to that list the real reason for my excitement is adding Elk and Black Bear to Missouri's species list will mean as hunters we have succeeded in restoring wildlife while protecting Missouri's wild lands. The amount of money it takes to achieve these goals is substantial and comes mostly from hunters and pro hunting originations just like MBH.

The protection of wild lands and the reintroduction of animals that were native to Missouri will benefit other Missourians as well the hunting community because of the amount of money spent in Missouri to visit these wild lands and possibly see Elk or Bear in the wild. I don't know if the sound of Elk bugling in the Missouri Ozarks excites you I know I will make it a priority on my bucket list of something to hear before I die.

As I write this the Missouri Turkey season is about one month away. The outlook for this season is again good and bad. Good because Missouri has a strong population of wild turkeys, bad because for the fourth consecutive year the number of poults observed in the MDC's brood survey was well below average. That means fewer turkeys to hunt, especially those gobbling two year olds that we all love. The MDC is again blaming the low reproduction on the wet and cold weather across much of the state during the nesting and brood rearing season. The MDC biologists have also concluded other population limiting factors like predators and disease have reduced the turkey population below the high numbers we experienced in the 1980's and 1990's.

Meaning you may need to do a little more scouting in order to get your bird this spring. One great way to scout is with your trail cameras. We put away our trail cams shortly after deer season closes. The cameras are a big help in trying to locate frequently used strutting grounds in preparation for the turkey hunt. About two weeks before season opens place your cameras in likely strutting areas to determine exactly how often and time of day the birds are using the area. Strutting areas are usually small openings in the woods like logging roads or glades in the Ozark terrain. Open pastures are also favorite strutting areas. The trick to hunting these fields is to locate either the highest spot in the field, gobblers tend to want to see and be seen by hens when they are strutting. Find the trail where turkeys enter the field. There may not be any trees close by to attach your camera so simply drive a steel fence post and attach the camera to the post.

One last thing about spring turkey hunting with a bow. Accuracy with your shot is critical on turkeys. If you miss that softball size kill zone on a turkey your chances of finding your bird are low. The turkey may die, but not before he flies or runs out of site and hides in a brush pile where you will never find him. Turkeys usually don't bleed enough to leave any kind of a trail to follow especially if they fly off. Be patient and wait for that close in shot. You heart will be pounding much harder with excitement when you make that shot at 10 yards instead of missing at thirty!
