A dominant buck will normally spend up to three days with an estrous doe during the rut. This amounts to 24 hours before she enters estrus, her approximate 24 hour estrous period and 12 plus hours after she cycles out of estrus.

Tye Wilson took this great buck just last month. Tye said he got into the woods a little late so he took his time, trying to be as quiet as possible.



Tye said when he found a tree that looked good, he just put his climber on and went up. Once there, he decided he didn't like the shooting lanes so he got down and found a new tree a little further down.

It was just light enough to shoot and he was going to put on his jacket but decided he would range some things, first. He was reaching for his rangefinder and saw this buck out of the corner of his eye. The buck was getting up from a bed not 10 yards from the tree he had sat in the first time.

Tye drew his bow back, but the platform of his stand shifted and his arrow quiver fell off his stand. The buck froze where he was and then suddenly stepped out, looked straight at Tye and then bolted about 20 yards. When he was able to take the shot, Tye held low on his 50 yard pin and made a great double long shot.

Give the Gift of Archery for Christmas

The importance of passing the sport of archery on to the next generation is the secret to the future of the sport. If the children of today do not have the opportunity to experience the sport, there is no way for the sport to be passed along. This being said, Christmas is a great chance for us to kick start youngsters into archery. There are so many pieces of archery equipment on the market now to help young archers not only get into the sport, but also make them feel welcome to continue the activity for years to come. Most bow manufacturers are now producing bows that are available in poundage increments that are appropriate for any age range as well as draw lengths that adjust with a growing archer. The best part about these bows is the fact that they are not \$800-900 like a full size, adult bow. In general, these bows are less than half that price. These bows are a great gift for any little boys and girls who are interested in the sport. Along with that, take time and be patient with the young archers. When a child first picks up a bow, they are basically feeling out the functional side of the sport. The drawing of the bow, release of the arrow, and the sound of the target are what they really want to do. Therefore, let them have fun and just feel it out at first. One of the big attractions to the sport to a youngster is that shooting "stuff" is just plain fun! Set up some 3D targets, balloons on practice butts, and some games that would promote the archer to have fun while learning the fundamentals. Something else that is changing the landscape of archery is the National Archery in the Schools Program. This, if you aren't aware yet, is a school program that helps schools get archery equipment and start school archery teams. This is one of the best ways to introduce kids to shooting. I am an assistant coach at a local school in my home town and I have seen the influence of this program. I have seen students that have never touched a bow in their life and within 2 or 3 months, they are shooting pie plate size groups at 10 and 15 meters. This is due to the close attention of NASP for the equipment they use. All the equipment is the same and is easy for the kids to learn from. All the bows used are the Genesis bow. This might not be the most technologically advanced bow, but it is one bow that virtually anybody can shoot. This opens the door for any student willing to give archery a try. Talk to your child's school (whether it be elementary, middle, or high school) and ask how they can get the NASP program started. If you have a basic knowledge of the basic fundamentals of archery, volunteer to help at a school that is participating in the program. Also, check out the NASP website for more details. In the same aspect, the 4H organization has seen a great amount of popularity in their archery program.

I think we have definitely seen how well our Missouri 4H Archery team has fared on the national stage and we are very proud of what they have done. Talk to your local 4H chapter and ask about their archery program or refer to the 4H website for more details. All these things will help us pass on the sport of archery to our children resulting in a flurry of passion and excitement for the sport and making it become bigger and stronger than ever. Who knows, your child might one day be putting in the final X for a Vegas win or be part of the USA Olympic Archery team. But in order to do this, they have to start somewhere!

A Note from a "Release" reader, Janis Grellner

For the last year it was on my mind, shooting my recurve at the Olympic Trials. Finally, I decided that if I was going to go to the Trials on September 30, 2011, I should develop a plan. I trained more frequently and incorporated specific exercises with light weights to enhance my archery muscles. I shot as many tournaments as I could, especially FITA outdoors. Knowing that at the Trials we were to shoot 144 arrows plus practice arrows I would need endurance. So later in the summer I began training in the morning and afternoon at 70 meters shooting about 70 to 80 arrows each session. As the Trials approached, my coach Larry Skinner, told me to focus on what a good shot feels like and not to shoot if something was not right; gambling was not an option. The day arrived and I was ready as I could be. I wanted to make the 16th cut by the end of the day. The schedule was to shoot four sessions of 36 arrows at 70 meters beginning at 8:30 a.m. Six arrows are shot within four minutes and repeated six times for a round of 36. The wind was a factor as it came up mid-morning ranging 18 to 25 mph. I shot 294, 268, 284 and 292 for a total of 1138. I missed the cut by two points. I was disappointed but I did shoot two personal bests!! It was an incredible experience. I was able to see and visit with many archery friends I only get to see at major tournaments. Also, watching and visiting with former Olympians was valuable.

Conservation Committee

This month I need some info from you. That's right I need to hear from the MBH members about any issues or recommendations that you have about conservation in the state of Missouri. In January MBH will have a Board of Representatives meeting where we will discuss several issues.

Those issues will include the clubs budget, tournaments, newsletter, election of officers, and committees. The committee discussions will include the Missouri Bow Hunters stance on conservation issues.

I want to accurately represent the MBH membership at the Conservation Federation's annual convention in February. At that convention we get the opportunity to speak with Missouri Department of Conservation personnel at several committee meetings that take place on Saturday. Typically the MBH representative will attend the archery committee and the deer & turkey committee meetings. At those meetings we will get reports from MDC biologists and regulation/protection personnel about game animal populations as well as a summary of the previous hunting seasons. Resolutions are also presented and voted on in the committee meeting. Resolutions can be recommendations for future hunting seasons, including methods, limits, and the length of the season. If a resolution passes the committee vote then it is brought before the general Conservation Federation membership on Sunday morning to be voted on. If it passes that vote it is submitted to the appropriate state and or federal agencies to be acted on. Two resolutions that passed were; **Request Action to Better Control Deer Population and Use PITTMAN-ROBERTSON funds to construct archery ranges in Missouri.** You can read last year's resolutions and the responses to them at <http://www.confedmo.org>. Search the word "resolutions". One resolution that passed out of the archery committee (by one vote) but was soundly defeated by the general vote was; **Allow the use of Crossbows during the regular archery season.**

So talk with you archery club's B of R or contact an MBH officer through the website or give me a call or send me an email. Let us know how you want your club to represent you! Hunting season update; harvested my second doe of the season on the morning of 11/11/11 and her field dressed weight was 111lbs. Too weird!
