RECEIPE **DRY RUB**

Dry rubs have become a popular way of tenderizing meat and giving it a distinctive flavor. One I found from Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation, worth passing on.

4 1/4 oz. of course ground black pepper

- 3 oz. smoked paprika
- 6 oz. granulated garlic
- 6 oz. granulated onion

1/4 oz. fine ground white pepper

- 2 tbsp dried thyme leaves
- 1 1/4 oz cane sugar

2 3/4 oz ground ancho chili

5 1/2 oz course sea salt

1/4 oz dried mustard

Combine all the ingredients and rub on meat 30 min. to one hour before cooking.



Conservation Committee

MBH members I am happy to report from the Conservation Federation of Missouri's (CFM) annual convention that a resolution for the addition of CROSSBOWS to the methods allowed during Missouri's archery deer and turkey seasons was soundly defeated at the CFM's general session vote on Sunday morning.

This resolution had passed out of two different committees on Saturday's committee meeting which is the first time this resolution has ever gotten that far. The resolution was passed through the Archery Committee and the Sportsman's Rights, Firearms & Hunter Safety Committee by one vote in each case. The same resolution was defeated in the Deer, Turkey, & Ruffed Grouse Committee by four votes. To quote lifetime MBH member Dick Wood "We were blindsided today by a stacked committee of Xbow advocates". We have weathered this storm but there will be more to come.

On the more positive side a resolution authored by Dick Wood was passed unanimously. This resolution asks the Missouri Department of Conservation along with the CFM and it's archery/bowhunting affiliates work to construct "world class" archery shooting facilities starting with the four major population areas of the state of Missouri, namely Saint Louis, Columbia/Jefferson City, Kansas City, and Springfield. Resolutions that pass are next presented to Missouri Conservation Commissioners and any other appropriate organizations to eventually become a reality.

One other aspect of my first CFM convention that I was very impressed with was the group of young people called the Conservation Leadership Corps (CLC). This group is comprised of young people ages 16 to 24 from all over the state of Missouri that have shown an interest in Conservation policies and procedures that will make up how we will manage our outdoor resources. The CLC is recruited and sponsored by the CFM and has proven to be a very valuable asset for the future of conservation. It was great to interact with the future leaders of Missouri's outdoor policies. If you get a chance checkout the CFM website at <u>www.confedmo.org</u>.
