**Brooke** took up the sport of archery in March of 2011 when she got her first bow. She came to watch me shoot in a local



league and said it looked like something she would like to try. We enrolled her in 4-H and she signed up for the shooting sports program. She began shooting in county invitational shoots whenever she could. Winning nearly every event she entered from the start.

Her indoor season began after she had

won the 4-H State shoot back in September. We were then told of the indoor shoots she could participate in. We were still very new to the whole archery shooting world and new nothing of any of these shoots. My first real contact was with Kathy Potter who pointed us in all the right directions on what to do as far as registering, signing up etc.

Brooke is 11 years old and shoots in the CUB FEMALE FREESTYLE division. She won first place at the Presley's Midwest Open, MBH NFAA Indoor's, Iowa Pro-Am, Kansas City Shootout, MAA State Indoor, NFAA Midwest Sectionals, MBH Deer Classic, MBH State Indoor and NFAA Nationals. She came in second at the World Archery Festival in Las Vegas.

Brooke is looking forward to moving up in divisions from CUB to YOUTH next year. She knows that a big challenge waits for her there, both in distance and competitors. She is also looking to get more involved in outdoor, 3-D and FITA shooting as her "archery career" progresses. She is going to be trying her hand in the recurve shooting world as well to see how that could go.

## 2012 Monas State Tournament

On March 24th, the 2012 Missouri National Archery in the Schools Program State tournament was held at the University of Central Missouri Multipurpose Building in Warrensburg. This event was promoted and organized by the Missouri Department of Conservation. 53 schools from around the state were represented resulting in over 1,169 competitors! This was the largest Missouri NASP state tournament held to date. The competition was very competitive and lead to some very exciting shooting. In the elementary team division, George Guffey Elementary took 1st place while St. Joseph Cathedral captured a 2<sup>nd</sup> place with Simpson Elementary took the bronze. The top 6 teams in the elementary division qualified to nationals by scores (minimum of 2800 points accumulated by team). The middle school division was won by Ridgewood Middle School and Holy Rosary coming in 2<sup>nd</sup>; Crane Middle School came in 3<sup>rd</sup>. The top 12 teams in this division qualified for the national championship by their score (2900 points and higher). Finally, the high school division top three was Crane in 1<sup>st</sup>, Willard in 2<sup>nd</sup>, and Galena in 3<sup>rd</sup>. In the end, the top 4 teams in the high school division was qualified for nationals (3000 points and higher). More results, including all the individual scores are online at nasptournament.org. At the end of the day, the officials held a "Coach's Challenge." Each coach was allotted one NASP arrow (Easton 1820, full length, NASP spec) and a Genesis bow; paired at a target with another coach. They made one shot and the shooter "closest to the center" will advance the loser eliminated. To compound the pressure, the officials had the students line the waiting line and root (cheering, screaming, and all out noise) for their coach. This was great fun for everyone in attendance. In the end, yours truly was blessed enough to make it through the round, finishing with a 10X to win the competition. If you recall from some of my past articles, I am the assistant coach at Holy Rosary (the same one as the 2<sup>nd</sup> place in Middle school division team for clarification). I was awarded 2 new Genesis bows, 2 new Morrell targets, and a bow case, which I donated the winnings to Holy Rosary. The next competition set for most of the teams that qualified is the NASP National Tournament. It will be held May 11<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> in Louisville, KY. This is an incredible program and I am honored to be part of NASP and of the Holy Rosary Archery program. I would like to say a big thanks to all who help their local NASP programs at schools by giving your time, the great folks at the Missouri Department of Conservation for putting so much effort into this program, and all the young students for taking interest in the sport. The future of the sport is bright my friends!

## CONSERVATION COMMITTEE

As promised here is a quick summary of what happened at the Conservation Federation of Missouri's (CFM) annual convention this past February.

Friday evening's Annual Awards Ceremony (sponsored by Bass Pro Shops) started with the U.S. Pledge of Allegiance and the CFM Mission Statement. Hopefully everyone already know s the Pledge of Allegiance so I will only state the CFM's mission statement to give everyone an idea of what the CFM stands for. "Missourians for conservation of natural resources and protection of our outdoor heritage." The eight individuals honored Friday night were all nominated by fellow Missourians for their outstanding work in the fields of education, communication, legislation, wildlife, forestry, and conservation.

Saturday morning's keynote session started with Director Robert Ziehmer's report on the MDC. He stated that of Missouri's 6 million total citizens' over 2 million of us enjoy hunting and or fishing and that another 2.2 million Missourians enjoy other outdoor activities such as camping, hiking, and bird/wildlife viewing in our state. In other words 7 out of every 10 Missourians participate in the Missouri outdoors every year. He also said that in Missouri conservation pays! Economic benefits to Missouri are over 11.5 billion dollars every year. 95,000 jobs in Missouri are a result of outdoor conservation activities and for every dollar spent by the MDC out of the state budget Missouri gets 72 dollars in return to the states economy. Yep conservation pays its own way in Missouri.

Next the Department of Natural Resources first lady, Sarah Parker Pauley, spoke to us about Missouri's State Parks. Missouri ranked in the top 4 in the country for state park attendance last year. Attendance was up 9% to over 18 million visitors. Every year Missouri ranks in the top 5 for favorite US States to go camping in. She also told us about the upcoming expiration of Missouri's Drinking Water Primary Fee. That fee was enacted in 1992 to help the DRN assure Missourians have safe drinking water and needs to be renewed by the state legislator as it expires this coming September 1st.

After the keynote session CFM member's attended various resource committee meetings. My wife Kim and I attended the Archery Committee and the Deer, Turkey, & Elk Committee meetings.

The Archery Committee Chairman was MBH member Dick Wood and the Co-chair was David Smith of Bass Pro Shops. A lot of you know Dick and as always he did a fine job representing Missouri bow hunters. David Smith is a Bass Pro Shops executive in his professional life but he is also a Missouri bow hunter and I spoke with him about my concerns having a major outdoor retail executive promoting resolutions that would help his business.

David assured me that although his job is to sell outdoor equipment he also knows that it is in his best interest to work with all Missouri bow hunters and that the business of bow hunting in Missouri is very good as is right now. We heard reports from MDC personnel about Operation Game Theft, archery deer and turkey harvests for last year which were both up and in fact bow hunters set a new record harvest last year of over 150,000 deer. Archery permit sales were also up by over 10,000.

Three resolutions were passed from committee as well. The first was to continue support of the NASP and Bow Hunter Education programs in Missouri.

The second was to initiate a study to access the feasibility of an archery only spring turkey hunting season. The third was to include in the telecheck system what method (i.e. rifle, handgun, bow, crossbow, muzzleloader, or atlatl) was used in the harvest of deer.

At the Deer, Turkey, & Elk committee meeting MDC biologists Jason Isabelle (turkey), Jason Sumners (deer), and Lonnie Hansen (elk) all gave reports.

The bulk of the meeting was spent talking about the CWD found in 2 free ranging deer last fall in Macon County, Mo. Both of those deer were killed within two miles of a high fence deer hunting preserve that had two deer that also tested positive for CWD. I can tell you the feeling in that room was not good. Everyone is very concerned with this development and the MDC is continuing to sample other deer to determine the extent of this outbreak. This is something we all need to keep informed about. This is a very serious threat to the Missouri deer herd.

The elk introduction into Missouri is going well. Currently there are 36 free ranging wild elk in Missouri, 31 adults and 5 calves. Of the 34 elk brought here last spring three died. One death was from old age, one died from brain worm, and we had one accidental death of a young bull when he jumped from the truck during unloading an injured himself. 35 more elk from Kentucky are scheduled for release this spring.

Saturday evening was spent at the banquet dinner & auction. It is a great time to speak with people from all over the state. There are lots of MDC personnel as well as representatives from most of the CFM affiliated organizations. As one of those affiliated organizations, MBH joins forces with some 80 other conservation organizations to represent the Missouri outdoor community. Not only to the state's government agencies but also to national and worldwide conservation organizations.

Sunday morning's general session is spent reading the resolutions that were passed from the 16 different resource committees. They were each voted on and either passed to be sent on to the appropriate government agency or failed and died on the floor right there. We passed 52 different resolutions from this year's convention. ## March 18th Meeting Minutes

The MBH BofR gathered at the State Indoor tournament on Sunday. The following clubs were represented:

Carroll County Bowhunters submitted a bid for the 2012 MBH State 3D Championship. The club proposed a 2 day event (August 11th-12th) to be held at their range (Walnut Hills west of Carrollton on Rt E). A total of 30 targets will be shot each day and center 12's will be scored. There will be a trickle start beginning at 7am on Saturday and will cut off at 11am. There will be a shotgun start on Sunday and shooters will be grouped with their peers. The fee will be \$35 for Adults and \$20 for shooters 14 and under. Carroll County will retain \$10 of the adult fee and \$8 of the youth fee to cover their expenses. MBH will run registration, provide awards and advertise in the RELEASE. Carroll county will setup the range and provide concessions on the grounds.

Discussion was held regarding the bid and Marvin made the following motion: MBH will pay 1 place for every 5 participants. A shootdown will be held for any class where 5 (or more) places are being paid. Shootdown scores will be added to the 2 day total to determine the winners. Darryl seconded the motion, a vote was taken and none were opposed.

Jeff made the following motion: MBH will pay 50% of the MBH entry fee portion for adult classes. Ties will be broken based on total # of 12's scored on day 2. Further ties will be broken at the discretion of the host club. Ryan seconded the motion, a vote was taken and none were opposed.

The bid submitted by Carroll County for the MBH State 3D championship was approved.

In other business, the group agreed that MBH clubs may advertise in the RELEASE calendar of events on competing MBH event dates ONLY if they are listed prior to the MBH event decision.

The MBH State Indoor Championship for 2013 will be held on March 9th and 10th. Unless an alternate location can be identified, the event will be held at Linn Tech.

Jeremy Mason made a motion to create a \$400 budget for the Ways and Means committee. The idea is to divide the state into sections and provide MBH kits (flyers, banners, etc.) that can be used at events to promote MBH. Jerry seconded the motion, a vote was taken and none were opposed.

No bids have been received for an MBH State 600 round. Clubs that are interested in hosting the event should reach out to MBH leadership. Meeting adjourned.


