# After a Little Research

In high school, I was on the newspaper staff. As part of a newspaper or any other type of publication, researching is one of the most important aspects of the publishing process to insure the integrity and accuracy of the stories. Occasionally I am asked, "what are the advantages to deer hunting to our community?" We'll, I thought it was time to do a little research to not only inform non-hunting readers, but also my fellow hunters on some of the numbers and statistics involved with hunting. It's no surprise that Missouri is a state rich in heritage and tradition including the most fundamental tradition of deer hunting. According to nhfday.org approximately 38 million Americans hunt and fish. Hunting and shooting is more popular, by the numbers, than playing golf. Businesses rely on hunting and deer season for the extra income needed in this economy. Wildlife restoration and rehabilitation projects depend on the money contributed by hunters. A portion of the venison harvested each year goes to people who are in need of food. A tradition Missouri shares with many states even though a bad reputation in certain areas, what it does for the environment and community is commonly overlooked.

According to nhfday.com, an average hunter will spend \$1, 638 on hunting each year. This is an asset to small businesses like our local sporting goods stores around the nation. They are dependent on the money generated from hunters buying the necessities; including tags, clothing, firearms or bows, and anything that would complete the hunt or trip.

In 1937, Congress enacted the Pittman-Roberts Act (otherwise known as the Wildlife Restoration Act). This states all the gear and firearms associated with hunting is to be taxed a certain percentage. The money that is collected from these purchases goes to state wildlife agencies, habitat rehabilitation, species restoration projects, population surveys, land acquisition, and hunter education projects. According to fws.gov, the national average funding for wildlife restoration produced by this tax is \$310 million. This act has come to be known as one of the most successful wildlife restoration projects in history because of the immense amount of money that is produced by the hunter through these taxes. In the early 1900's, the populations of the white-tailed deer, antelope, bear, and turkey were incredibly low. Thanks to the Pittman-Roberts Act, these species are flourishing and abundant due to the money received from the industry that went to research and other activities to restore the populations. Other than game animals, many other species have benefitted from the Act. Waterfowl, quail, dove, and pheasant are just a few.

Something that Missouri, as well as other states have acquired is a program to help people who are in need of food. The Share the Harvest program was implemented so that hunters can donate the venison harvested to the MO Department of Conservation, the meat will be given to those be in need. Reported by governor.mo.gov, Missouri deer hunters donated 4200 full deer to Share the Harvest in 2011. Hunters donated 213,000 pounds of venison in the 2010 season. As of February 2010, the program has donated over 2 million pounds of venison. All the meat donated goes to the folks who need the most.

The statistics for this year's hunt aren't complete, these examples show how influential hunters are. It's very important that we know our influences on the environment and the economy. Be proud of our roots as hunters! Continue the tradition!



# CONSERVATION COMMITTEE

I want to say thank you to the following cubs that responded to the MBH Bowhunting Survey that I sent out in late January. ABI Archery, Absolute Archery, Cherokee Bowhunters, Macon County Archery, Marshall Bowhunters, Millersburg Archery, Nodaho Bowhunters, NOMO Bowhunters, State Fair Archery, & Summit Archery.

MBH has approximately 400-450 members and there are 33 different MBH clubs/ranges across the state. I sent the survey to those clubs/ranges in late January. I got responses from 11 of those clubs. Here is a summary of that survey.

#### **Crossbow Hunting**

91% were against allowing crossbows during regular archery season for anyone to use.

73% were against allowing crossbows during regular archery season for youth 15 and under.

However 64% of the returned surveys were in favor of allowing crossbows during regular archery season for adults 60 and older.

I did get several comments about allowing handicap hunters to use crossbows which is currently allowed during regular archery season.

#### **Missouri Deer**

55% felt like the deer population is declining too much but 45% said it was not.

55% want to limit doe permits and 45% do not want to limit doe permits.

82% want the archery season to remain the same length and dates.

64% are okay with buck permits as is and 36% want to reduce the number of buck permits.

It seemed as though responses were somewhat regional. Deer number comments were negative in rural areas of Missouri and positive around urban areas of the state.

#### Missouri Turkey

55% felt like the turkey population was not declining too much and 45% thought it was.

73% thought turkey permits should not be more limited.

82% were in favor of an archery only spring turkey season and all day hunting in the spring.

I will submit a resolution for a Spring Archery Only Turkey Season at the CFM Convention.

#### Large & Small Game Committee

55% were not sure what this committee does.

64% had never turned in a large or small game harvest report.

55% do not know what awards are given out by the committee to MBH members.

Looks like I need to get the word out about this committee and possibly make some changes to the awards given. I will get back to you on this one.

Kim & I are just back from the Conservation Federation of Missouri's annual convention. We were both very impressed with the passion & dedication the members show for conservation including the 100 or so college & high school students that make up the Conservation Leadership Corps.

We successfully presented 2 resolutions for the Missouri Department of Conservation to consider. The first is proposing a Spring Archery only Turkey season. The second to consider adding what method was used to harvest deer to the telecheck call in. We thought it would be helpful to know whether archery, rifle, handgun, atlatl, muzzeloader, or crossbow was used during what season. The subject of hunting with crossbows during archery season never came up at the convention. Look for a full report next month.

Congratulations to the above participants on their accomplishments!

As customary, I make a brief summary of the past bow hunting season by our members.

With over 400 members, and I know not are all bowhunters, only nineteen members took the time to turn in reports. There was a total of 49 reports submitted. Six members killed one deer. Four killed two, five killed three, one had taken five and two killed seven. Of the deer reported, thirty two does, fifteen anterlered bucks and only two buttons. This is the first time since doing these reports that no P&Y entries were turned in, though many were pictured in the Release.

This is the third time in the last 21 years of making this summary that the average shot was over twenty yards. Some years back it was at thirteen yards, but this year it was all of 20.17 yards. We had two members that used crossbows and their yardage was not figured in due to some of the longer yards they reported.

If one got up early to hunt, this year you had the advantage, with thirty reports in the a.m. and only 17 in the p.m. of deer taken.

The carbon arrows are still dominating the bow hunting world with forty-four reports compared to only three with aluminum. What is really surprising is with all the hype of mechanical heads only twelve members used them compared to thirty-four with fixed.

Of the areas hunted, five deer were taking on public ground and fortyone on private ground. Forty-one white-tails from tree stands, two from blinds and three by means of stalking.

The age class of our hunters always seem to interest me. With our youngest member at nineteen and our oldest at eighty four, an average of 54.7.

For the turkey seasons, there were three spring reports. In brief, three birds were turned in by two members. All three toms were taken from blinds with the average shot at just 15.6 yards. There were two taken with carbon and one aluminum type of arrow and two fixed and one mechanical broadhead. All three were taken on private ground.

There were twelve fall reports with four members killing two birds. The average shot was 24.3 yards, with eight hens and four toms taken. Seven of the birds were taken in the a.m. and two in p.m. Five birds were killed from tree stands, four from ground blinds and two by means of stalking. The type of arrow used, eight with carbon and only two with aluminum. Seven members used fixed and only four used mechanical. On some the reports, those that killed more than one, both deer and turkey, might have used fixed blade on one kill and mechanical on another.

Nine kills came from private ground and two from public.


If some of the figures don't add up to the total harvest on both deer and turkey, it is because some of the reports were not complete.

As in the past, I thank those that took the time to fill out the Large Game report and make this information possible.

As many of you know, the Share the Harvest program started in 1992, through the efforts of a group of MBH members that made this possible. The numbers are not in for 2011, but for 2010 more than 5,000 whole deer were donated, which yielded 350,000 pounds of ground venision. Share the Harvest with the cooperation of the Missouri Department of Economic Development, Missouri Department of Conservation, Conservation Federation of Missouri, Bass Pro, Shelter Insurance, Missouri Meat Processors, many local organizations and Missouri Food Banks are making it possible for Missouri hunters to donate to the cause without any out of pocket expenses for the processing. Just thought you'd like to know!


