Update from East Fork Rock'n Shots...

Indoor season for the East Fork Rock'n Shots club is in full swing. The Indoor JOAD program kicked off in September and will continue through April 2014. JOAD club members are leveraging 4 different sessions to meet weekly and develop their shooting skills. A total of 28 club members have participated in qualification rounds for this season and earned JOAD awards based on their scores (see chart on the right).

CONSERVATION COMMITTEE

This month I'd like to talk about an important opportunity for the Missouri Bowhunters Association. Missouri Department of Conservation Deer Biologist Emily Flinn sent me the following letter;

Mr. Blystone;

The Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) is proud to share an opportunity with the Missouri Bowhunters to contribute to an innovative white-tailed deer research project. The goal of the research project is to evaluate survival, recruitment, and movement patterns of white-tailed deer in two Missouri regions. Landscape-level changes in habitat condition, deer densities, hunter selectivity, and predator populations over the last several decades have likely affected deer survival rates; however the extent is unknown, which can influence MDC's ability to effectively manage deer populations. Regulation recommendations based on models that do not accurately reflect current deer population characteristics because of the incorporation of outdated information could lead to poorly informed management decisions. This is of critical importance as misguided regulations have the potential to negatively influence hunters, landowners, production landowners, and motorists.

Therefore, MDC is proposing a project that would ultimately increase the accuracy of population models that guide Missouri's deer regulations by generating region-specific estimates of white-tailed deer survival and recruitment rates. Secondly, this project would investigate deer movement patterns, which can affect the spread and distribution of diseases, including chronic wasting disease (CWD) and bovine tuberculosis. For disease management plans to be effective it is imperative that they include movement information that is reflective of the land and deer population in which the management actions are being applied. Therefore, this project will increase the effectiveness of disease management strategies by incorporating land cover effects on deer movements. Ultimately, this research project will be of interest to many stakeholders as it will encompass a variety of topics including habitat effects on deer movements, predation rates on fawn survival, and deer harvest rates.

This proposed deer research project will tentatively begin in January 2015 and require six years to implement and analyze. There will be a minimum of 240 deer, including fawns, bucks, and does, monitored annually for movements and survival. This research project will be performed in cooperation with the University of Missouri; therefore the research team will be composed of a university professor, MDC scientists & biologists, post-doctoral student, master students, and field technicians. Final approval for this research project will be associated with the MDC's annual fiscal year budget approval in June 2014.

At this time we are initiating communication to identify organizations that may be interested in providing financial or in-kind contributions (i.e., equipment, supplies). I look forward to communicating further with you and the Missouri Bowhunters on this progressive research project that will effect deer management in Missouri for decades!

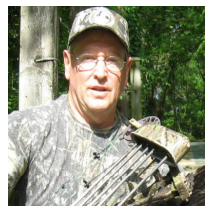
