Now then, as the summer is starting to finally roll in, there are many op-



LARGE AND SMALL GAME COMMITTEE

Since I was unsuccessful in Missouri's Spring Turkey season and I have received no Spring Turkey Harvest Reports from MBH members (deadline for spring reports is June 15th) I thought I would tell you about my Wyoming Merriam's Turkey Hunt. My wife Kim & I headed to Sundance, WY on May 4th for a three day Merriam's turkey hunt with Seven J Outfitters. Kim loves to turkey hunt and we have always wanted to chase those mountain birds with the lighter colored tail feathers. Day one wakeup call came at 3:15am with a light breakfast. After short rides in the pickup and ranger UTV we were set up between three Toms and several hens. The birds up there sure talk a lot more than the ones back home. Kenny our guide knew exactly where to be and after a mile long pursuit thru the pines Kim downed her 1st Merriam's at 6:45am. She was very excited and the hunt was off to a great start! Most of the next two days consisted of Kenny putting us on at least four different Toms within easy shotgun range but each time the birds were moving or saw me draw my bow and took off.

Bow hunting without a blind proved to be very difficult. I did launch one arrow at 8:30 the first morning. Kenny had called 2 Toms up a logging road to within about six yards of me. I tried to draw when the strutter leading the way was behind a tree but the second bird saw the movement and they started slowly walking away. My arrow gave one of the birds a haircut at 20 yards, but arrow was clean so all I got was a few feathers. After two days of frustration I picked up the 12 gauge to try and fill my tag on the final day. We covered miles of Black Hills National Forest with the Polaris Ranger. In the afternoon we hunted one of the many leased ranches that Seven J has access to. During the last hour of the last day I was able to fill my tag with one of those beautiful Merriam's.

I really enjoyed chasing those birds with my bow but in the end I'm glad I switched and filled my tag with the shotgun. I believe you could harvest one with your bow from a blind easy enough but you would miss out on a lot of great countryside that Kim & I enjoyed while chasing those birds around the forest.

Our guide Kenny is a bow hunter and understood my reasons for pursuing these birds with my bow. Kenny has been guiding at Seven J for 12 plus years and in all of those seasons only two bow hunters have managed to harvest a bird without using a blind and in both cases Kenny said they were lucky to find the birds after the shot. Kim & I highly recommend Seven J Outfitters and I am sure we will return to hunt there again.

News From The Stump....

Well, it's finally starting to warm up and feel like summertime. Hope everybody is making time to get outdoors and enjoy the awesome weather we're enjoying. Social media is full of pictures and articles related to members attending outdoor 3D and target events. For others, it's time to rest and/or spend time with family and friends. It won't be long before the fall hunting advertisements and promotions start shifting everybody's thoughts to broadheads!

The NFAA Midwest Sectional Outdoor championship is scheduled for June 22nd/23rd and Independence Bow Hunters will once again serve as host location for the event. A second location in Andover, MN gives Midwest NFAA members options to select a location that best fits their geographical needs.

The event will begin with a shotgun start on Saturday morning at 9am. Participants will shoot 28 targets (4 arrows each) on what is called a Hunter target face.

On Sunday, we will again begin with a shotgun start and participants will be grouped to shoot with their peers. Participants will shoot 14 targets (4 arrows each) on what is called a Field target face and then follow-up by shooting 14 targets at an animal paper target.

Please see the attached chart for details related to the scoring. You can also access all the official details related to field archery round by accessing the Constitution and Bylaws document via the NFAA website at www.fieldarchery.org. Once you go to the website, just select 'Documents' and then scroll down until you see the C&B for 2013/2014.

There are a number of changes that recently went into effect on June 1st, Here are a few that might be of interest:

- The Master Senior age group was changed to 70+
- Senior age bracket has been moved to 50+
- A new Silver Senior age group was created for 60+
- Bowhunters Freestyle now offered to ALL age divisions
- Pro division field archery scoring modified to allow an x to count as a bonus point (Pro Division only)

Again, you can read all the 'official' details by accessing the newly published Constitution and Bylaws. If you are unable to access a copy, please contact me and I'll be glad to help you!



• **YOUTH** (12 through 14) Shoot the adult stakes up to 50 yards. Any adult yardage over 50 yards will have a **Blue Marker** which indicates the youth shooting position.

• **CUB** (Under 12) Shoot (4) arrows from the **Black Markers**.



• **YOUTH** (12 through 14) Shoot the adult stakes up to 50 yards. Any adult yardage over 50 yards will have a **Blue Marker** which indicates the youth shooting position.

• **CUB** (Under 12) Shoot (4) arrows from the **Black Markers**.



STANDARD UNIT

14 targets from a Unit. Twice around a Unit makes a Round. (Qualifier)

TARGET FACE SCORING

1st 21 points x-ring
20 points vital
18 points wound
2nd 17 points x-ring
16 points vital
14 points wound
3rd 13 points x-ring
12 points vital
10 points wound



An arrow shaft need only touch the line to be counted in the area of the next higher value.

SHOOTING RULES

A maximum of (3) marked arrows may be shot, in successive order, and the highest scoring arrow will count. In the case of walk-up targets the first arrow must be shot from the farthest stake, the second arrow from the middle stake, and the third arrow from the nearest stake, in order to be scored.

DISTANCE MARKERS

• **ADULT** (Over 18) **Yellow Markers** indicate the yardage, and shooting position.


• **YOUNG ADULT** (15 through 17) Shoot from the adult **Yellow Markers**.

• **YOUTH** (12 through 14) Shoot the adult stakes up to 50 yards. Any adult yardage over 50 yards will have a **Blue Marker** which indicates the youth shooting position.

CONSERVATION COMMITTEE

Thanks go to all of you who spoke out against legislative bills HJR 36 and HB 962 that I talked about in last month's article. I received emails from Missouri legislators Tim Jones & Todd Richardson letting me know that the bills never made it out of committee. Hopefully enough of us let it be known that undermining the MDC's authority will not happen without a fight.

Here's an update from The Missouri Department of Conservation's website on Missouri's elk restoration effort. On May 21st forty more elk were added to the Missouri herd. MDC added 20 adult cow elk, 16 yearling cow elk, three yearling bull elk and one newborn calf. Thirty-nine elk started the journey west from Kentucky and along the way one of the pregnant cows gave birth.

The newborn calf is doing very well and has been nicknamed "Plus-1"! This year's group of 40 elk will add to the approximately 70 already living in the restoration zone. Several dozen new calves expected to be born this spring from the established elk, plus more calves are expected from this year's group of 20 adult cows. This marks the third spring that elk have been reintroduced into Missouri. Missouri's elk restoration zone consists of 221,000 acres in parts of Shannon, Carter, & Reynolds counties. As in the past two years of elk restoration efforts, the 12,000-acre Refuge Area at Peck Ranch, where the elk tend to congregate, is closed into July as new elk acclimate and cows give birth.

MDC will open the area to elk driving tours later this summer. Thanks go out to The Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation, Safari Club International, Big Game Hunters Foundation, and Bass Pro Shops for their generous funding and support of this project.
