However, after spending a little time going through them, I realize that there is so much history here. One box held old cassette tapes of B of R meeting minutes, while another held score cards from events held back over the last several years. Probably the most fun one to go browsing through, was

the huge tub filled with copies of Releases dating back to 1963, or at least that's the oldest one we have been able to find.

I thought it might be nice to show a few of these bits of history off throughout this coming year. The two pictured here are from September, 1963 and June 1965. The cover of that 1963 Release features Barry Hazen, the 1963 Field Archery Champion. While the 1965 Release features Owen Jeffery, who had taken top honors at a tournament that had been held in April, 1954 north of Huntsville, with a caption asking "Were you there 11 years ago?"

Looking at these copies, many of the club names are unfamiliar, but yet there are others like NOMO, Independence Bow Hunters, and Northside Archers that are familiar, and who also share this long and rich heritage that is Missouri Bow Hunters.

It is now time for our Board of Representatives to do their job and take on the responsibility to allow the necessary changes to be made. I encourage everyone to try and make it to our next Board of Representatives meeting on February

If you are a B of R Representative, now is the time to make a difference in our success as an organization. MBH has had critical moments in time throughout its history and this is one of them. It is imperative that MBH that continues to grow and expand, and the 3D side of archery is where MBH is lacking.



As we start the New Year I wanted to talk about a very

vation out of politics. Their initiative petition campaign resulted in the creation of the Missouri Department of Conservation, a non-political conservation agency that has been a model for other states. Since then, the Federation has undertaken many successful battles to ensure Missouri continues to be the leading state in conservation policies and funding. In 1976, CFM spearheaded successful passage of the conservation sales tax to create stable broad-based funding for Missouri's forests, fauna and fish. Today CFM is the largest and most representative conservation group in Missouri. It is a citizen's organization with 70 affiliated clubs all across the state. The Missouri Bow Hunters is one of those affiliated clubs. As an affiliated club we team up with the other clubs to present a powerful voice for Missouri Conservation not only with our state legislature and conservation department but also nationally.

One of the best ways I know of to see what this organization represents and does for Missouri outdoor enthusiasts is to attend the CFM Annual Convention held each spring. This year's convention is March 21-23 in Jefferson City. Each year the convention highlights include; an Annual Conservation Awards Ceremony, the chance to meet Conservation & Natural Resource Leaders, attend several different resource committee meetings where state biologists and other experts give reports on the status of various wildlife and natural resources and where you can hear or present ideas to the states governing organizations, a great dinner banquet including auctions and raffles that include lots of outdoor gear, guns, and trips that raise money to support CFM, plus several family and youth programs being held during the convention.
