Great News from Columbia!

In a historical event, at a historical place, history was made today!

Governor Nixon announced yesterday that he was holding a press conference this morning at the Tiger Hotel in Columbia. Why the Tiger Hotel? It was here in 1935, that the 100 plus outdoor enthusiasts/sportsmen held the 1935 meeting that resulted the in Conservation Federation of Missouri being formed! The order of business was then an initiative petition drive to put on the November 1936 statewide ballot, the opportunity for voters of the state to establish the Missouri Department of Conservation Commission and the MDC as a state agency independent of the General Assembly.

The Tiger Hotel was also the site for the CFM to recently celebrate its 75th Anniversary, with Gov. Nixon as the keynote speaker. It was there that the Governor challenged the CFM to reach a goal of 10,000 deer being donated each year for Share The Harvest. At that meeting, Bill Crawford, a conservation legend and former 43 year employee of the MDC, was also present for the 1935 (at age 17) and the 2010 meeting! Bill Crawford was also in attendance for today's meeting, and received a standing ovation.

History made? Yes...the MDC Commission yesterday also announced that they were going to have a Commission meeting this morning at the Tiger Hotel with only one agenda item to be addressed by Gov. Nixon. To the best of my knowledge, the Commission has

never before been addressed by a Governor during a Commission meeting. It was also stated that this Commission Meeting had the largest attendance ever. More History made? Yes...an ovation lasting perhaps 2 to 3 minutes erupted when the Governor announced that he had earlier that day, vetoed both bills containing the "captive deer to livestock" language.

Do not be complacent with winning the Governors vetoes. That is meaningless unless we get either the House or the Senate to vote to sustain the vetoes in their chamber. This will be the General Assembly's last chance to get it right! If they don't hear from you and 25 folks that you recruit to make similar contact and requests, they will think they did get it right and the Bills will become law in August. Summertime Shooting

State Outdoor turned out quite well with the weather conditions that we had. With a down pour all the way up to the shotgun start, it was nice to see quite a few shooters stick around and wait out the rain. It turned out to be a ridiculously hot and humid day! It made for a tough day to focus on the shot, but there were still some incredible scores shot! Congrats to everyone! It was great time and I saw a few new faces on the field ranges! Also, a big congrats to everyone at the ASA State Championship in Sedalia as well!

State Outdoor is essentially our last outdoor/summertime tournament in MBH, but that doesn't mean we are done! In October, we will hold our annual Youth Championship at Indian Trails Archery in Salem. We are really looking to boost this tournament. I know good and well that there are more youth shooters in this state than we could ever imagine. To go to the NASP state championships and see the numbers of shooters there, there are plenty of shooters to gain. There are over 1000 NASP shooters every year at the Missouri state championships and all of the 3D/Indoor/Field youth in ASA and NFAA, we have many people to recruit. This will be our next goal. This will be an indoor tournament and there will be both NASP and NFAA divisions available. We know October isn't always the best time in archery with archery hunting seasons in full swing, but with it being this early in October, it shouldn't be that intrusive on the prime time of the season. If you've ever done much early season hunting, you'll know about the "October Lull" that creeps its way in right about that time, so missing this weekend in the season is much better than missing the first or second weekend in November. We will fill you in on more details as we get closer.

Lastly, at State Outdoor, we had a BofR meeting to come up with nominations for our election in October. We have Steve Bridger and Jeff Freidman running for President and Jerry Denker and Dan Jasa running for VP. Now, since we have a large influx of new members due to the growth in both State Indoor and our 3D Championship, I need to stress the importance of your vote. Governor points out Missouri Constitution gives Conservation Commission sole regulatory authority over wildlife; says bill provisions are clearly unconstitutional. Gov. Jay Nixon today vetoed two bills that would have redefined the term "livestock" to include captive deer in order to eliminate the role of the Missouri Department of Conservation in regulating white-tailed deer. The Governor said those provisions of Senate Bill 506 and House Bill 1326 would go against longstanding successful conservation practices and also would clearly violate the Missouri Constitution, which gives exclusive authority over game and wildlife resources to the Missouri Conservation Commission.

"For more than 75 years, our Department of Conservation has been held up as a model for wildlife management agencies across the country because of its incredible success," Gov. Nixon said. "Redefining deer as livestock to remove the regulatory role of Department defies both its clear record of achievement as well as common sense. White-tailed deer are wildlife and also game animals—no matter if they're roaming free, or enclosed in a fenced area."

In his veto message, the Governor cites the exclusive authority of the Missouri Conservation Commission provided by the Missouri Constitution under Article IV, Section 40(a). He also said that under the stewardship of the Missouri Department of Conservation, the state's population of white-tailed deer has grown from fewer than 2,000 in the early 1930s to an estimated 1.3 million today, and that the 500,000 deer hunters contribute \$1 billion to Missouri's economy. "Growing and managing our deer herd and fostering the hunting opportunities that we enjoy takes hard work and sound science, and the Department of Conservation should be commended for employing both to preserve this important part of our heritage, not stripped of its authority to do so in order to protect narrow interests," the veto message reads.Gov. Nixon noted that "it is unfortunate that the legislature insisted on amending this unconstitutional provision to two pieces of legislation that otherwise contain worthy provisions advancing Missouri agriculture."The Governor discussed his actions on the two bills at a special meeting today of the Missouri Conservation Commission in Columbia. I was also able to attend one of the MDC public meetings about Missouri deer management. I went to the meeting in Lee's Summit, MO on July 2nd. The meetings are being conducted in an informative open type format that allows you to browse between the different informational tables and MDC personnel that are there.

I spoke with deer biologists, Conservation Agents, and Private Land Conservation Specialists about regulation changes, habitat improvements, and the future of Missouri's deer herd. I thought the meeting was successful and it allowed me to speak one on one with MDC personnel. MDC is asking for public opinion on regulation changes including things like moving the firearms season one week later in the year, allowing only one buck harvest per hunter no matter what method is used, removing the firearms antlerless only season, and allowing crossbows during the regular archery season. I hope you made an effort to let the MDC know your opinion about future deer management in our state. Opening day for archery season is less than 75 days away as I write this and I'm looking forward to getting back on the hunt!

It time to go on line at http://mdc.mo.gov/hunting- trapping/deer-hunting/2014-2015-managed-hunts and apply for the special manage hunts that the Missouri department of Conservation conducts every year. The application period is July 1st through July 31st. Note; the application timeframe has been shortened so hunters have more time to be notified of their selection for earlyseason managed hunts. To find out if you've been selected go on line at http://mdc4.mdc.mo.gov/ applications/managedhunts/checkresults.aspx. Results will be posted by September 2, 2014. It's a simple process and you may get an opportunity to hunt a great area. Even if you don't get drawn for one of the hunts this year you still earn preference points so that your chances are better for next year's draw. You can also look up the 2013 Managed Deer Hunt Summaries. All of last year's hunts are listed with your chances of getting drawn for any particular hunt and what the hunter success rate was for all of the hunts. Last year there were 17 archery only hunts offered and another 29 hunts for archery or crossbows. The Archery only hunts had an average success rate of 41%. That's pretty good odds and a lot of the hunts offer the opportunity to harvest a buck and multiple does. I drew a tag in the Burr Oak Woods CA last year a managed to harvest a doe on the sixth evening. I saw lots of deer and turkeys but the shot opportunity didn't happen until the next to the last day of the hunt. It is also a good idea to take the Missouri Bowhunter Education Coarse if haven't done so already. Some of the Urban Hunts will require you to be Bowhunter Education Certified. You can find the locations

and register for the classes at the following website link, http://www.register-ed.com/programs/missouri/12-missouri-bowhunter-education-classroom-course. Currently there are nine classes listed throughout the state. It's also time to start shooting your bow in earnest to prepare for the upcoming season.

Make sure you practice a similar setup to the one you will be using for the hunting season. During the outdoor 3D and target season I often switch to lighter arrows for flatter trajectory. The arrows I use for targets are too light for hunting in my opinion. My target arrows only weigh in at 7 grains per inch. I shoot a 28 inch arrow with a 100 grain point. My total arrow weight is around 325 grains and that's too light for good arrow penetration in my opinion. For hunting I use the same nocks, veins, and broadhead weight but I switch to heavier arrows that weigh 9.3 grains per inch. That increases my total arrow weight to about 390 grains. I get complete pass through penetration on deer using mechanical broadheads and only pulling about 58 lbs. draw weight. It's been a good setup for me anyway.


