One of the Best Weeks in Conservation Happenings Just Took Place!

1. Gov. Nixon appointed Dave Murphy as the new Commissioner! Dave brings to the table what has to be the resume for "Best Qualified Commissioner" appointed ever. *(see page 10 for the news release)*

2. Rehan Nana started his work for the Con. Federation of MO. Rehan exudes talent and enthusiasm for the task of Deputy Director of the Conservation Federation of Missouri! We welcome him back to Missouri. *(see article on page 12 for the news release)*

3. The MDC Commission (with Dave Murphy on board) yesterday approved the new regulations of captive deer as recommended by the MDC Regulations Committee. The new code revisions will now need to go through the lengthy regulatory process before becoming effective.

I want to thank all of you who were able to attend the Commission Meeting to show our support to the Commissioners for these direly needed regulations. Yesterday's presentation on Chronic Wasting Disease by Dr. John Fischer was outstanding. Dr. Fischer is a MO native and seems to be the foremost expert in the nation on diseases in wild animals. He was able to relate facts regarding CWD that even this realoguy could comprehend.

Presentation: National Overview of Chronic Wasting Disease/Deer Health Issues. Dr. John Fischer, Director, Southeastern Cooperative Wildlife Disease Study, College of Veterinary Medicine, The University of Georgia, Athens, Georgia. Introduction by Tom Draper, Deputy

Director and Chairman, Regulations Committee. I urge each of you that are not an individual/family members of the Conservation Federation of Missouri to go to the website and join. I have been a member since 1960, a sustaining member since 1966, and a Life Member shortly after that type of membership became available.

The CFM is the organization that established the Missouri Department of Conservation in 1936 by initiative petition; established the funding of the Design for Conservation in 1976 by initiative petition; promoted the establishment of the highly successful Soils and Parks 1/10th tax in the 1980's (which gets renewed every ten years by statewide vote - normally 70% + in favor !!!)

The CFM has played a huge part of major programs that are now partnered with the MDC such as: Operation Game Thief - Oct.1-1982 (I remember it well); Share The Harvest - 22 plus years ago; National Bowhunter Education (thanks to Don Roper and Vearl Pemberton); National Archery in Schools Program (thanks to a host of folks including the leadership of Jeff Friedman-MBH, Tom Dickerson UBM, and Don Johnson-CFM); and Stream Team is thriving with the MDC and originated with CFM!

To summarize, the battle for the protection of Missouri's deer and elk herd from CWD, is being lead by the Conservation Federation of Missouri.

Our attendance topped out at 93 shooters this year, which was a nice improvement over last year's tournament by approximately 30 shooters.

Carroll County Bow Hunters put on another great tournament, and the new format and rules seemed to work very nicely. Through trial and error, we have found a couple things that need to be improved on. There were no huge issues, just a few things that we needed to test in a real situation to see what some of the weaknesses would be. That being said, we have a great start on next year! We will continuously strive to improve and grow this event and make it bigger and better every year. I'm writing this just before the State 600 Tournament, and hope to see this grow as well. The format is becoming very popular and I hope everyone considers making it to a tournament like this.

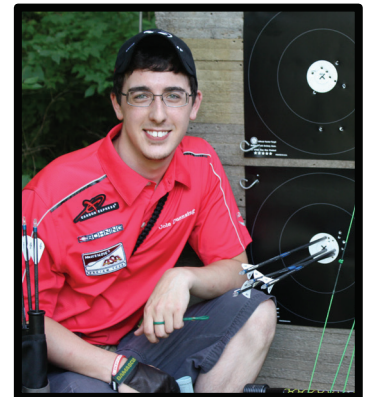
Speaking of that, we are also seeing a resurgence of interest in the NFAA Field/Hunter/Animal round-style shooting lately. This interest is slowly transmitting into a few more shooters showing up to local field shoots, which is the perfect time to get the word out about field-style shooting and the upcoming State Outdoor/Field Tournament. It is very difficult to build interest in someone who has never heard or thought about a type of shooting. All we need is to have a group of shooters that are beginning to try it, and that interest can easily be contagious. For those of us who have shot NFAA field rounds, get someone who either is not familiar, or someone who hasn't shot this type of course, to come with you to the field course and try it. For many people, after trying field once, they are hooked and are excited to try something other than the indoor or 3D shoots. For those of you who have never tried it, I recommend two things: 1) find a friend who shoots field and ask them to show you the ropes and give it a try; 2) check out the NFAA rule book, get the run down on the specifics of the game, and jump in head first! While the idea of the field round may seem somewhat intimidating to some, and speaking first-hand from my first

experience trying it, there are tons of people at field shoots that will be more than happy to fill you in on anything you need to know.

I will tell you the absolute truth about my first field tournament, it was the NFAA Sectional Tournament hosted by Independence Bow Hunters and held at Landahl Park in Blue Springs last year, all I knew was that I needed marks out to 80 yards and that was about as far as I got. So, the week before, I set marks out to 80 and headed to Landahl Park the first day of the shoot. I shot with a group who had lots of field experience, and they were very willing to help me with any questions I had. By the end of the day, and after the first 122 arrows, I already knew this was now my favorite type of shooting. The variety of shots, being out in nature, and just experiencing something different absolutely had me hooked! After that tournament, I can't imagine missing any field shoot!

I encourage you to check out our Calendar of Events and find your way to a field shoot! Our State Outdoor Tournament is coming up on July 13, and will once again be hosted by Independence Bow Hunters, and will be held at Landahl Park, and should be another great MBH event! Yes, it's the same weekend as the ASA state shoot, but I know quite a few people who are shooting ASA on Saturday and our MBH Outdoor on Sunday. PLEASE, give field shooting a try, you won't regret it!

If you have been reading the Conservation Committee articles over the last several months you already know that the spring 2014 State Legislative session was probably the most challenging session that supporters of our states Design for Conservation have faced in recent history. Challenges to the Missouri Department of Conservation, the Citizen led Conservation Commission, and our states sound biological methods of managing our outdoor resources were under attack all spring. The Missouri legislature seems to have the MDC in their crosshairs and wants more control over Missouri's Billion Dollar outdoor industry. The Conservation Federation of Missouri and its affiliates were successful in stopping almost all of the attacks by presenting lawmakers with sound reasoning, public testimony, and historical proof that our current system of managing Missouri's fish, fauna, & wildlife works! However as I write this one piece of legislation is sitting on Missouri governor Jay Nixon's desk awaiting his signature to make it law. Senate Bill 506 was "Truly Agreed To and Finally Passed" on May 15, 2014 by a 70% favorable vote. It was delivered to the Governor on May 30th. This bill was introduced and sponsored by Senator Brain Munzlinger of district 18 which includes 14 counties in north east and north central Missouri including most of the counties in the MDC's Designated Chronic Wasting Disease Containment Zone. The bills original form included only the reclassification of captive cervids to become livestock and be under the control of the Missouri Department of Agriculture. Both the departments of Conservation and Agriculture testified opposing this bill, however it continued to be amended until enough so called good amendments were added to the bill to get it passed. The amendments included several changes to help dairy farmers and also provide \$400,000

in scholarships to students in agriculture-related degree programs. While I agree that scholarship money and helping dairy farmers are both worthy of consideration they are not worth risking our wild deer herd and the billion dollar deer hunting economy in our state! This bill if signed into law by the Governor will also allow Missouri deer "farmers" to sell the venison they produce. I'm afraid this will encourage more captive deer "farms" which could further risk the spread of CWD into our wild deer herd.

The Department of Agriculture does not at this time have the manpower or financial means to monitor and enforce any fencing requirements or disease testing that needs to be done to protect Missouri's wild deer herd.

The captive cervid industry knows this and is exactly the reason they got this legislation introduced.

All we can hope for at this point is for a Veto by the Governor or possibly that the Department of Agriculture is willing to include and work with the Department of Conservation to control the captive cervid industry.

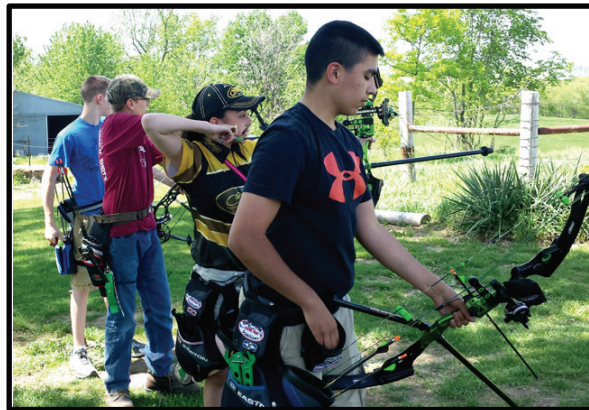
An Update from East Fork Archery Shooters

May has been a busy month for EFA Shooters! We kicked off our Rock'n Shots Outdoor JOAD program this month and held our first Outdoor Qualification Round. A total of 20 JOAD Shooters participated and we had 18 successful qualifications. Breaking it down, 7 Shooters competed and earned their first pins at 15 meters (minimum distance), 5 Shooters qualified at 20 meters, 3 Shooters qualified at 30 meters and 3 Shooters qualified at 40 meters. A couple of our youngest shooters competed at 15 meters and earned their lanyards. We see pins coming their way very soon!

Gov. Jay Nixon today appointed Lewis County native and former executive director of the Conservation Federation of Missouri **Dave Murphy** to the **Missouri Conservation Commission**. Murphy (D) has been appointed for a term that expires June 30, 2019.

Murphy grew up in northeast Missouri, where he graduated from Canton R-V High School and still owns and operates a 376-acre farm in Clark County. In 2013, he retired after 10 years as the executive director of the Conservation Federation of Missouri. Before serving in that position, Murphy was a regional director and field supervisor for the National Wild Turkey Federation. In 2009, *Outdoor Life* named him as one of the 25 Most Influential People on the Future of Hunting and Fishing.

Murphy was instrumental in helping Gov. Nixon greatly expand and improve the Share the Harvest program to enable deer hunters in Missouri to donate venison through local meat processors and food pantries and food banks for Missouri families in need. He earned both his master of science degree in wildlife biology and his bachelor of science degree in forestry, fisheries and wildlife from the University of Missouri.

The Missouri Conservation Commission controls, manages, restores, conserves and regulates the bird, fish, game, forestry and all wildlife resources of the state, including hatcheries, sanctuaries, refuges, reservations and all other property owned, acquired or used for such purposes, as well as the acquisition and establishment of those properties.

Murphy's appointment will be subject to confirmation by the Missouri Senate.

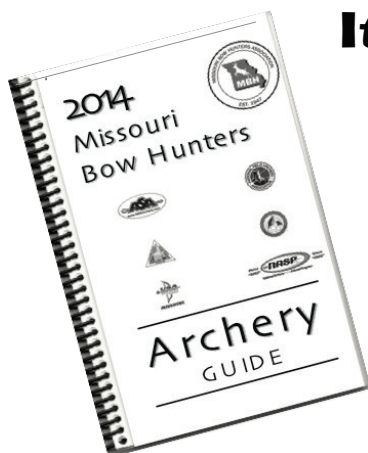
