Squirrel Hunting; a little slice of hunter heaven during the “off” season.

Spring Turkey season is a short lived bit of excitement for those of us that crave the hunt. It gives us a chance get up early in the morning and get out in the field to hopefully get a bit of that familiar adrenalin rush. Nothing quite like calling in a Missouri Gobbler! What could possibly compare? Squirrel Hunting with your bow, that's what! Squirrel season opens the end of May and runs until the end of January. It's time to get revenge on that squawking critter that let everyone know you were in your tree stand. If you've never tried shooting a squirrel with your bow, get ready for a real challenge.

First of all, finding them is more difficult than you might think. The squirrels in the woods are much more wary than your neighborhood type. They have a distinct advantage with their treetop view. Secondly, aiming high up into trees is not an easy task, nor is retrieving your arrow. Here are 5 things I have learned from my resident squirrel hunting master Gaylon Russell.

Wear soft soled shoes and camo and hunt in early morning when the dew is still on the ground to keep your stalking quiet. (I need all the help I can get to be quiet).

Use a blunt type small game head on your arrow that will not stick in a tree or get hung up in branches. (You will miss.... a lot).

Fletch your arrows with large feathers called flu-flu. They will be easy to see and slow you arrow so it does not travel too far for easier retrieval. (Flu-flus will tickle your nose at full draw, try not to giggle).

Don't be foolish and not take advantage of a ground shot. (If I catch one pausing on the ground, it's like a gift from God).

Hunt with a partner and have them work the opposite side of the tree so the squirrel comes around to your side. (I get to be the squirrel dog, a lot).

Sure, you can hunt squirrels with a shotgun or .22 rifle, but really....try your bow. Not only is there no shot to pick out of the meat, but you can earn small game patches towards your NFAA Bow Hunter award. Best of all, you can cook some of the tastiest meals you have ever tried, like squirrel and dumplings, or the yummy Bushy Tail Pie recipe I have included in this months' Release. So get out there soon while the mulberries are ripe, and try shooting a squirrel with your bow.

Prepare the Squirrel.

3 Squirrels – cut up and soak in salt water in the refrigerator at least 24 hours. Rinse Squirrel parts and place in large saucepot. Cut up ½ onion, skin and all, and a large handful of celery tops leaves and all, add to pot. Add a little salt (1/2 teaspoon) and enough water to cover well. Bring to a boil and then turn down to simmer. Simmer for 3 hours. (Go make the crust while your squirrel cooks, and cut up the veggies. When squirrel is done, pick the meat off the bones. Strain broth and retain broth for gravy.

Prepare the crust.

1/2 cup butter flavored Crisco
1 cup flour
¼ teaspoon salt

Cut mix Crisco with flour and salt until crumbly, sprinkle with 1 to 2 tablespoons of water enough to get the dough into a ball. Wrap ball of dough in plastic wrap and put in refrigerator.

Prepare the vegetables.

1 cup thinly sliced carrots
1 medium potato cut into ¼ inch cubes
½ cup chopped onion
½ cup thinly sliced celery
½ cup frozen peas
2 Tablespoons butter
1 Cup of water

Put water and butter in saucepan, bring to boil, add carrots, cover, let cook 3 minutes, then add potato, cook another 5, and then add the rest of the veggies and cook another 3 minutes stirring frequently. Water will evaporate down so you can just add the veggies into a large bowl with the squirrel meat.

Prepare the sauce. (preheat your oven to 375)

4 Tablespoons butter
4 Tablespoons Flour
½ teaspoon salt
1/8-1/4 teaspoon white pepper
1 ½ cups of broth
¼ cup of milk. (mix with broth)

Melt butter in saucepan, add flour, salt and pepper; stir until smooth and bubbly. Add broth and milk slowly as you stir to keep smooth. Cook until desired thickness (about two minutes).

Make the pie.

Pour the sauce over the squirrel and veggies in your bowl. Stir to mix, then place in your 1.5 quart casserole. Roll out your dough just a little bigger than your dish and place on top of casserole, trim the edges and poke a slit in the center to vent. Use extra dough to make decorative accents on your casserole if desired (I make little bushy squirrel tails.) Brush top with one egg yolk. Bake 30 minutes at 375.



CONSERVATION COMMITTEE REPORT

Let's talk about two important subjects this month. One **BAD** and one **Good**.

BAD – Chronic Wasting Disease. NEW FOR 2016 The Department will require hunters to present their deer, or the head with at least six inches of the neck intact, for CWD testing at an MDC sampling location on the day of harvest if they harvest it in one of the 29 CWD-management zone counties in northern, central, and east-central Missouri during the opening weekend of the fall firearms deer season, Nov. 12 and 13. The testing is free and hunters can also get free test results. Sampling locations will be listed in the 2016 Fall Deer & Turkey Hunting Regulations and Information booklet and online at mdc.mo.gov.

CWD has the potential to end deer hunting as we know it. The Missouri department of Conservation is doing everything they can to slow the spread of this fatal disease but it is spreading and changing deer hunting regulations every year as it spreads. With the recent discovery of CWD in Northern Arkansas the potential for Missouri's southern deer herd to become infected has increased substantially. Frankly I don't know what to do other than monitor the spread of the disease and get the deer I harvest tested before I eat them. It's not good so we had better enjoy the deer hunting we have now because I'm afraid it's going to get worse before and if it ever gets better. GOOD – Bowhunter Education Classes. **WHY SHOULD YOU BECOME BOWHUNTER-EDUCATION CERTIFIED?**

- While it is not required by statewide game regulations, many cities that allow archery hunting inside their city limits require the bowhunter be bowhunter-education certified to take part.
- Some landowners or special corporate landholdings may require hunters to be bowhunter-education certified before hunting on their land.
- Many other states require bowhunter education before hunters are allowed to apply for or take part in bowhunts in their state.

LARGE & SMALL GAME COMMITTEE

I have received only one Spring Turkey Report so far.

Jim Brinkmann, Labadie, 22 lb. Gobbler, 10" beard, killed in Warren County on 4/19/16, eight yard shot from a blind.



I was able to attend the 2016 Instinctive Shooting Clinic held at Black Widow Custom Bows in early May. Instinctive shooting is shooting an arrow where you are looking without the use of sights, the point of the arrow or any other kind of reference. Accuracy is accomplished by concentrating on what you want to hit, isolating that from everything else around it, and allowing your hand, eye, and brain to coordinate and direct the bow hand and the arrow at the target. It just like throwing a baseball, you simply look at where you want to throw the ball and let it fly. Your brain's hand and eye coordination takes care of the rest.

Every spring since the year 2000 the man that actually wrote the book on instinctive shooting, G. Fred Asbell has been conducting the clinic. Fred has written many books on hunting with the bow and arrow. He also started Big Horn Bow Company and was the president of the Pope & Young Club for 18 years. Ken Beck, who is the former owner of Black Widow Custom Bows also joined in to help us learn. These two archers have been around the world bowhunting using traditional gear and instinctive shooting. The 3 day clinic included individual instruction on form, technique, concentration, and bow set up. Fred would talk and show us what to do and then we would go to the range and shoot. I shot lots and lots of arrows. Ninety-five percent of that shooting took place with the target only 5 yards away. Why you ask? Because just like throwing a baseball the proper form, rhythm, and sequence is critical to accuracy. Once your mechanics become automatic then you start learning with the mind where to point your bow arm for different distances. On day two of the clinic we were all video recorded while shooting and then after dinner we sat down to watch our videos and critique what we were doing wrong as well as right. We also got to tour the Custom Bow Factory and learn what Black Widow does to make a custom bow.

It was great to learn from the best and to spend time with the "Brothers of the Bow" as Ken Beck says. The clinic I attended included folks from Delaware, Iowa, Illinois, Michigan, Missouri, Montana, New Jersey, Ohio, Tennessee, Texas, Wisconsin, and Stuttgart, Germany. A diverse group of archers I must say. We had a doctor, veterinarian, truck driver, utility worker, accountant, oil and gas well guy, data processor, and a Ducks Unlimited land manager. So if traditional archery is something you might be interested in, be sure to give Black Widow Custom Bows in Nixa a look. They have a great demo bow program and you can stop by the shop to try out any of about 100 different bows right there in the showroom. You can visit their website at www.blackwidowbows.com to see the true works of art these folks build in Nixa, Missouri.
