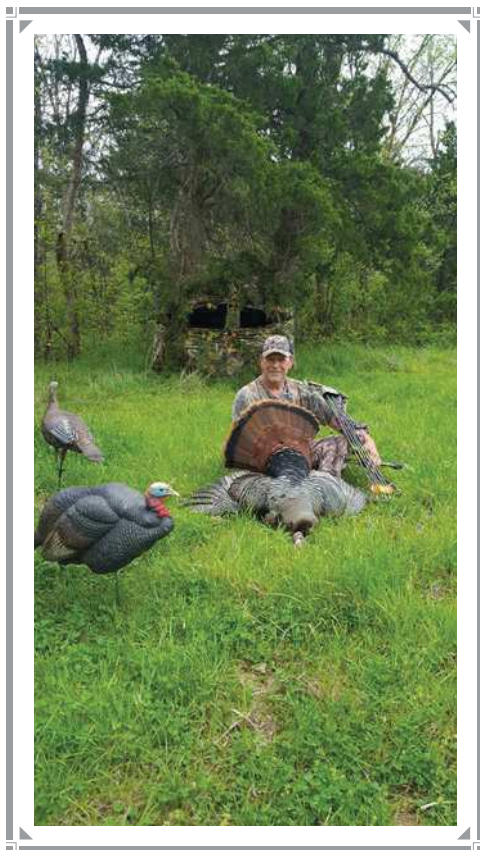

CONSERVATION COMMITTEE REPORT

The annual convention of the Conservation Federation of Missouri is always an enjoyable time for my wife Kim and me. It's a very busy, festive, and uplifting experience. I always come away from this annual meeting feeling good about the great team of people all across our state that are working to keep Missouri wild lands, parks, lakes, rivers, and wildlife managed for wise use by a growing population. At the same time it always seems like there's so much more that needs to be done. It's a bit overwhelming but I try to remember that the CFM is made up of thousands people in over 80 affiliated organizations. CFM affiliate members hike, bike, canoe, fish, hunt, bird watch, garden, farm, manage forests, rivers, lakes, streams, prairie, urban and suburban habitat, State Parks, CORPS land, and Conservation areas. CFM membership includes all types of people who either work professionally in our outdoors or politically to protect it. It includes Missouri Governor Jay Nixon and First Lady Georganne Nixon who were awarded 2015 Conservationists of the Year at Friday night's Conservation Achievement Awards Ceremony all the way down to a simple bowhunter like me who is just trying to help out any way I can. The point is CFM has folks who care about Missouri's outdoors in every possible place that affects it. This year marked the 80th annual convention of Missouri citizens meeting to share ideas, raise money, hear status reports, pass resolutions, and enjoy each other's company while working to make Missouri a better place to play outside!

The third weekend in March at the Capitol Plaza Hotel in Jefferson City kicks off with an awards ceremony on Friday night. 12 conservation awards are handed out to professionals in Forest, Fish, & Wildlife, political activists, educators, and youth conservationists. There are also several scholarships awarded to people pursuing a career in conservation.

Saturday at the Convention is the Main Event. Starting at 8:00am with opening speeches. This year Missouri Department of Conservation's Deputy Director Tom Draper talked for a few minutes about MDC's upcoming challenges with deer diseases, special interest groups, and a political environment that thinks they need to fix a system that has worked for Missouri since 1937.

Next up Department of Natural Resources Director Sarah Parker Pauley discussed her #1 priority this year, the renewal of the one-tenth-of-one-percent sales tax that provides funding for Missouri State Parks and historic sites and soil and water conservation efforts. This is not a new tax; it was first approved by voters in 1984 and has since been renewed by voters 3 times in 1988, 1996, & 2006. It will expire in 2016 if not renewed by public vote. This tax which costs about \$7 a year per Missourian accounts for 75% of the park system's budget to operate and improve parks and historic sites. The rest of the morning was spent in various Resource Committees. I served as the Vice-chairman on the Archery Committee and conducted that 90 minute meeting along with Chairman Dick Wood. The meeting consisted of a summary from the 2015 archery season, discussion of the effects new crossbow regulations will have on the 2016 season, a presentation about the Archery Hall of Fame in Springfield, and one resolution that was passed to Not Allow Air Guns/Bows during Archery Season. For those that don't know what they call an air bow it is a CO2 compressed air rifle that you load a full length arrow into and shoot it like a gun. Take a look at this video, <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=dwqMkjYjmtw> about the Benjamin Pioneer Airbow.

I next attended the resource committee about deer, turkey, & elk. In this meeting we discussed regulation changes to the CWD management zones, heard status reports from MDC Biologist's Barbara Keller on the elk restoration and Jason Isabell on the turkey project. One resolution was also passed from this committee asking MDC to "Extend Turkey Hunting Hours" by making it an all-day hunt instead of stopping at 1pm.

There are 14 different resource committees dealing with everything from camping & hiking, waterfowl, upland game, youth conservation, sportsman's rights, ecology & climate change, forestry, fisheries, grasslands,

furbearers, parks & natural history, and rivers, streams, & water resources. You have to pick the two committee meetings that you are most interested in.

From these committees came 21 different resolutions that were passed by the general assembly on Sunday morning. Those resolutions will be forwarded on the appropriate state agency for an official response. Basically what we do this weekend is to brainstorm and make proposals for regulation changes, laws or studies that we feel would benefit all Missourians and that have to do with the environment and its resources.

Saturday night is the highlight for the weekend. There is a great silent auction with lots of weekend trips, gear, clothing, artwork, crafts, books, and just about anything you could think relating to outdoors to bid on. Raffle items are also available. Then we all sit down to enjoy a wonderful dinner and drinks. After dinner the live auction gets going. Good stuff and great fun bidding for a favorite item.

Sunday is the wrap up business meeting where we make a final decision on the resolutions passed by committees. Finally the CFM board members like me get to hang around for another couple of hours to take care of the business of running the Federation.

This report could be a lot longer but I'm sure you're tired of reading and I'm tired of writing so if you have any questions please send me an email or give me a call and I'll do my best to answer. In the meantime check out <http://confedmo.org/> to learn more about CFM.

I'll leave you with one last quote from the great Missouri conservationist Andy Runge.

"We are justly proud of our past achievements, but acknowledge, with Shakespeare, "what's past is prologue." From the struggles of the past we have gained the knowledge and strength required for the future.

The happiness and security of generations of Missourians may well depend on the depth of our commitment to meet the challenges of tomorrow."

In the Bowhunter class, Brian Bogess shot a 407 and in the Senior class Larry Mincy was tops with a 408. Halle Clement was the top archer in the Cub Competitive class (13 & under) with a very impressive 405. In the Female Open class, Julie Griggs got top honors with a 392. Conner Young also shot an impressive 399 in the Youth (age 14-17) division.

We are excited that Nodaho Bow Hunters will be hosting the State 3-D Jamboree August 13 & 14. We will do our best to make it a memorable shoot for everyone and we invite you to join us! 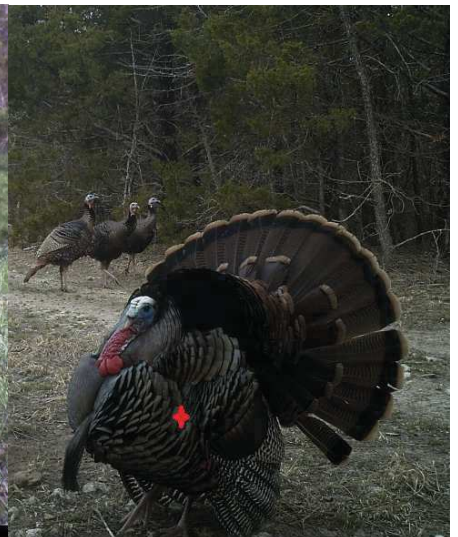
