

My Deer Hunt

Four years ago, I moved from Utah to Missouri. I got my first bow for my 9^{th} birthday. 2016 was the first year I shot the Missouri Indoor State Archery tournament. That year I placed 1^{st} in the cubs bowhunter class. Last year I placed 2^{nd} to my now good friend Emily Williams.

2017 was the first year I went bowhunting for a deer. My first set was a hot afternoon, we saw nothing. Our second set we saw 3 deer but could not get a clear shot. On our third evening out it was very windy, so my dad thought it would be a good idea to take my sister's crossbow instead of my compound. It was October 15, 2017. We got to the deer stand around 3:00 O'clock. It was a special October day. I could feel it in my blood. It would be the day I would kill my first deer.

We were in the deer stand probably 2 hours before we saw anything. The first deer we saw was a huge doe. When she got in shooting range she looked at me in the eye, and I blinked fast and scared her off. Then about a half hour later, a button buck came out. It walked all the way around the stand before I could get a clear shot.

When I shot it, I was so happy! My dad said something, but I was too excited to listen. I asked if I missed it? He said "no you made a good shot". I could not believe I made a good shot on it. A few minutes after the shot, another deer walked out, and I thought it was the one I shot, and I had missed. My dad assured me it was not the same deer.



About 30 minutes after I shot it we went to find it. We tracked it for about 80 yards. We finally found it. We wanted to make sure it was down, so we waited for my dad's friend Allen to get there, it was about 10 minutes. They went up to it to make sure it was dead. It was, so I came over to check out my first deer ever!

We took a couple pictures, then drug it out so we could get it field dressed. My dad skinned and deboned it while I took a shower and got ready for school the next morning. We had it made into summer sausage, for the entire family to enjoy. It was the best experience of my life so far.

LARGE & SMALL GAME COMMITTEE

I have not received any new MBH member Large Game Reports in the last month. Please remember that your MBH membership must be current to be eligible for the awards program.



Remember if you want a chance at any of the annual large game awards and the **Double Bull Blind Giveaway** you must have your report turned in by February 15, 2017. All MBH members who submit a Large Game Report will get one entry into the Double Bull Blind drawing to be held at the 2018 State Indoor Tournament next March 3rd & 4th in Linn. MO. If you send me a picture of you and your kill you will receive a second "bonus" entry into the drawing. There is a maximum of two entries per member.

Winners of the individual categories will receive a certificate of achievement suitable for framing and recognition in the MBH Release Newsletter. The report can be found and filled out on our web site at www.mobowhunters.org under the Game Awards tab. All MBH members are eligible to earn the Missouri Bowhunters Large Game Award pin when they turn in their first ever Large Game Report. Deer, turkey, & predators qualify as large game in the program. Game killed with a crossbow is not eligible unless the MBH member has a handicap exemption.

CONSERVATION COMMITTEE REPORT

This month let's talk about Chronic Wasting Disease testing of your deer. If you harvest a deer from any of the 41 counties listed in the CWD Management Zone you should get it tested for CWD and get the results before eating the meat. The disease is still rare in Missouri however it has been detected in wild deer and is spreading. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention encourages hunters in outbreak zones to have each deer tested, and then only consume the venison if CWD was not detected. I hunt mostly in Hickory County which is one of the 41 counties in the current CWD zone. While a CWD positive deer has not been reported in Hickory County it is right next door to St Clair County in which two CWD positive deer were reported last year. Before 2016 there was no reason to suspect CWD diseased deer in that part of Missouri however two mature bucks harvested in 2016 had been taken to a local taxidermist to be mounted. As part of Missouri's testing program taxidermists are requested to submit the deer's limp nodes for testing. This taxidermist did and both bucks tested positive for CWD. Going into the 2017 season I had already prepared myself for the fact that I would need to have any deer harvested from our hunting farm tested. On October 11 my son harvested his first archery deer. It was a beautiful 3&1/2 year old eight point and he was very happy. The deer looked to be very healthy and was making a scrape when Casey arrowed him. We processed the deer, labeled the meat, put it into the freezer, and removed the skull cap with the antlers to mount. I then located a local taxidermy shop that was listed on the Missouri Department of Conservation's website at https://huntfish.mdc.mo.gov/hunting-trapping/wildlife-diseases/chronic-wasting-diseasecwd/voluntary-cwd-sampling-stations. I took the head and about six inches of the neck to Tanning Unlimited Lakeside Taxidermy in Hermitage, filled out some paperwork on the location of the kill and then waited. I checked the CWD Test Results website by going to http://mdc7.mdc7.mdc.mo.gov/applications/cwdSurveillance/cwdSurveillance.aspx . You enter the Conservation ID number of the hunter that killed the deer then click on the button labeled Get Results. The taxidermist warned me that it would take several weeks before the results were known. I started checking after about a month and each time all I got was "results pending". Finally on December 12th when I requested the answer came back as "not detected". I now know the meat is safe to eat. While it is a pain to wait for test results I feel like it's worth the wait to make sure the meat is safe to eat. My wife also harvested another 3&1/2 year old 9 pointer during the first weekend of rifle season. That deer became part of the mandatory CWD testing in Hickory County.

I found the same result of "not detected" on that deer December 19th. The mandatory testing results will come in quicker however it still took over a month. When we processed the deer we packaged and labeled everything as usual and waited for the results before eating it. Hopefully the deer from my hunting area will never contract CWD but I realize someday I may not be able to consume my harvest and when that happens it will be a very tough pill to swallow.
