




Officer Nominees

LARGE & SMALL GAME COMMITTEE MISSOURI POPE & YOUNG BUCKS!

I was killin sometime during a rainy day recently and decided to look over the 4th edition of the Pope & Young Bowhunting Records of North American Whitetail Deer (volume 4). This record book covers all entries up to December 31, 2014. I was specifically looking at my home state of Missouri and I did get kinda interested in the entries by county. There are 2,431 entries from Missouri, 2,235 are typical, 196 are non-typical, and 3 are velvet entries.

The three velvet entries were from Adair County in 2007, St. Louis County in 2008, and Gasconade County in 2012. Missouri had 4 Counties with more than 60 entries.

<u>Jackson County</u> had 74 entries, top scoring typical was an 11 pointer coming in at 173&5/8. Top non-typical was a 24 pointer totaling 199&6/8.

St. Louis County had 73 entries, top typical was a 10 pointer scoring 188. Top non-typical was a 21 point scoring 191&1/8.

Boone County came in 3rd with 72 entries, top typical 167&5/8 eleven point buck, non-typical top spot was a 183&1/8 eighteen pointer.

<u>Putman County has 65 entries</u>, best typical buck scored 163&5/8 with 10 points, and best non-typical was a 196&6/8 with 15 points.

Of the four top counties 3 of them contain 3 of Missouri's largest cities. Three of them are also bordering the Missouri River. #1 Jackson County is home for Kansas City and the northern border is the big MO. #2 St Louis County is home to St. Louis and again the northern border is the Missouri River. #3 Boone County IS bordered on the south by the river and is home for Columbia.

My opinion about big city bucks is two fold. First of all, age class in the big city area is older because of less hunting pressure. Lots of private land and city limits allow bucks to grow old without being shot at thus getting a chance to get big, all they have to do is dodge all the traffic! Secondly if they are hunted and harvested it will most likely be with archery equipment. Cities and county parks are increasingly allowing archery hunting to manage overpopulation. All though you will probably have to kill a doe or two before you can hunt the buck legally. The city and park hunt managers have learned that bowhunters don't mind shooting does but we hunt harder and longer if there's a chance at a big buck so they allow bucks to be earned by killing a doe first. That manages the herd and gives bowhunters that incentive to stay on stand.

I also think the Missouri river plays a part in growing big bucks. River bottoms have very fertile soil that grows great crops, at least when it doesn't flood. Flooding plays another role. Few people or livestock live in the Missouri River flood plains allowing deer to live undisturbed. Cover along the river is also good, if you have ever tried to put up a treestand in August along the river you know about how thick and mosquito infested it can be. In fact five out of the top six Missouri Pope & Young record book counties for entries border the Missouri River. You can expand on that a little if you take into account the Mississippi River as well. Then its 7 out of the top 11 counties border either the Missouri or the Mississippi Rivers. There is also quite a bit of public land available to hunt along the rivers. Between the Corps of Engineers and the Missouri Department of Conservation buying land from willing flood victims over the past several years there are thousands of acres open to hunting along the river flood plains. Often this land will require you to do some hiking to get from the parking area to the river but that also cuts down on the hunting pressure. So if you're willing to work for it you may just get a chance at the buck of a lifetime along the Mighty MO!
