LARGE & SMALL GAME COMMITTEE 2018 MBH Large Game Awards

This year's winners received a framed certificate and recognition in the Release.

1st Spring Turkey- Winner -Vernie Broyles, 21 lb. Tom killed at 6:22am on 4/16/18 in Newton County.

1st Fall Turkey- Winner – Jim Brinkmann, Hen killed at 8:30 am on 9/26/18 in Franklin County.

1st Deer- Winner -Allen Boesch, 60 lb. Doe killed at 8:30am on 10/9/18 in Perry County.

Last Deer- Winner – Jeff Reddy, 84 lb. Doe killed at 5:30pm on 1/15/19 in St. Louis County.

<u>P&Y Typical Best Buck</u> – Tim Donnelly, 144 & 3/8" Net Nine Pointer. Tim's deer had a gross score of 150 & 1/8". Killed with a recurve bow in St. Clair County on 10/26/18.

<u>Lucky Deer-</u> At the start of the season an average field dressed weight is chosen at random by me. The member that harvests a deer at that weight or closest to it wins the Lucky Deer Award. 2018 weight was 99 lb. *Winner – Kathy Brinkmann killed a doe that weighed in at 98 lbs. on 11/9/18 in Franklin County.*

Grand Slam Award- If any MBH member fills their Archery Permit (2 deer & 2 Turkey) they will receive this award. Winner – Jim Brinkmann was the only member this year that filled all 4 tags and submitted the Large Game Reports to win. Jim killed turkeys on 9/26/18 and 10/9/18. Jim also took five deer this past season. 3 Does killed in October/November 2018 and 2 Bucks in November 2018.

P&Y Non-Typical Best Buck- Winner -No Entry

Here is a summary of the large game reports turned in this year by MBH members.

DEER

24 deer reports total, 11 does, 12 bucks, & 1 button buck.

8 members submitted harvest reports. Two members harvested 5 deer, two members killed 3 deer, and four members killed 2 deer.

Average shot distance was 21.25 yards; average distance to recovery was 75 yards.

All deer were killed on private ground.

18 deer were arrowed in the PM hours and only 6 in the AM hours.

23 were taken from treestands and 1 from a blind.

Compound bows killed 16 deer, 3 deer were killed with a recurve bow and handicap crossbow got 5. Average bow draw weight was 58 lbs. Carbon or Composite arrows were used in all of the kills. Mechanical Broadheads took 9 deer and fixed blade broadheads killed 15.

TURKEY

5 turkey reports total, 3 spring reports and 2 fall reports from 2 members. Average shot distance was 17.6 yards; average distance to recovery was 24 yards. All 5 birds were taken on private ground in the morning hours from a blind. Carbon arrows and mechanical broadheads were used in all kills.

I would like to give a little recognition to a few of the Missouri Bow Hunters Association members that turned in reports this past year. I would like to give hearty congratulations to Jim Brinkmann who was the only MBH member to earn the Grand Slam Award in 2018. Jim harvested 5 deer and 4 turkeys in Missouri during 2018. To top that off he also won the Yeti cooler drawing held at this year's State Indoor Tournament. Longtime MBH member Tim Donnelly turned in 2 reports this year that he harvested using Traditional archery gear including this year's highest scoring buck. The oldest members submitting reports this past season were Vernie Broyles and Allen Boesch at 78 years young; Vernie killed the first spring turkey in 2018 and Allen harvested 5 deer this past season. Allen has been hunting the last few years with his crossbow due to bad shoulders and arms but he is still in the field and being quite successful.

Time to say so long for now but remember spring turkey season is almost here so start practicing you're calling and shooting skills!

CONSERVATION COMMITTEE REPORT

The second weekend in March found me in Jefferson City attending the annual Conservation Federation of Missouri's convention. The weekends scheduled included conservation and scholarship awards Friday night; Saturday's events consisted of resource committee meetings, affiliate luncheon, resolution committee meeting, Conservation Leadership Committee youth meeting, evening dinner and live auction; Sunday included voting on final resolutions and the CFM board meeting.

The resource committee meetings on Saturday morning are really the meat and potatoes of the convention. I was the Chairman of the Archery & Shooting Sports Committee and MBH member Kurt Surber was the Co-Chairman. I was very pleased to see MBH President Bill Myers in attendance this year. This year instead of the usual reports from the Missouri Department of Conservation biologists about the past season, new regulations being considered, and the status of crossbows in archery season were heard a couple of positive presentations. MBH member and Springfield Archery Complex manager, Amy Francka gave a presentation about the archery complex and it archery shooting programs. This archery range is truly top notch and Amy is doing an excellent job running the facility. In fact MBH members will have a chance to shoot in two MBH tournaments this year held at the Springfield Archer Complex. MBH State outdoor 600 round will be on May 4th at the complex and the MBH State Outdoor Field Tournament will be at the complex on July 6th & 7th this year. Consider shooting one or both this year you will enjoy the experience. The CFM Archery and Shooting Sports Committee also heard from Russ Chambers and Ken Barnes who told us about shooting programs they are involved with in the Boy Scouts of America. It's good to hear that the scouts are still very much a part of teaching and training America's youth on how safe and how much fun shooting guns and bows outdoors is.

I next attended the CFM Affiliate luncheon where we ate a great lunch, got to socialize with like-minded conservationists from a very diverse group of CFM Affiliate organizations. Several Affiliate Organizations were awarded grant monies for conservation projects. Next we heard a presentation from Mr. Rudy Roeslein, the founder of Roeslein Alternative Energy about the process which converts agricultural and industrial wastes along with renewable biomass feedstocks to renewable natural gas and sustainable co-products. We also passed 7 Resolutions this year; 1- Support for Raising Missouri's Wildlife Violation Fines; 2- Repeal Missouri Legislation Outlawing Plastic Bag Ban; 3- Incentive Program to Maintain Privately-Owned Pollinator Habitat; 4- Support Efforts That Would Increase Responsible Use of Prescribed Fire as a Habitat Management Tool; 5- Support Eleven Point, Bryant Creek, Ozark Mountain, and Jay Nixon State Parks; 6- Halt Sale of Weldon Woods; 7- Support for Feral Hog Eradication. The CFM Annual Convention was a great success again this year. We raised more money for Missouri Conservation efforts at the banquet Saturday night. The raffles, silent auction, and live action events are a lot of fun and some good stuff can be had for very a reasonable price. I always enjoy spending the weekend representing the Missouri Bow Hunters Association and hanging out with all of the great folks who think the Missouri Outdoors should be enjoyed, managed, preserved to benefit all Missourians.
