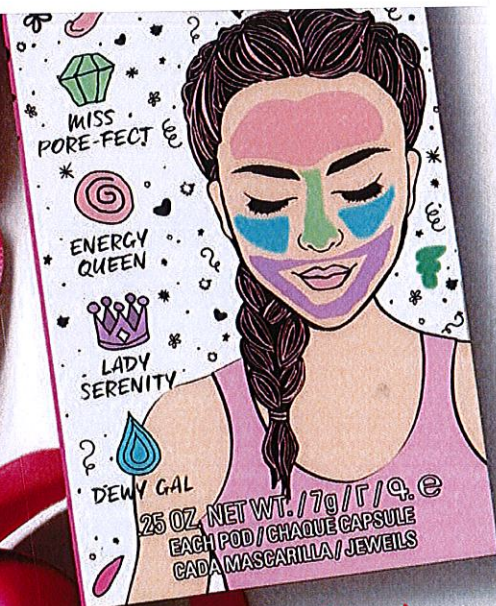

LARGE & SMALL GAME COMMITTEE

Last month I was telling you about the managed deer hunt I was participating in at Longview Lake. Well here's the conclusion of the hunt. With only one week left to hunt and still needing to fill the required doe tag to earn my buck tag I switched from my recurve to my Hoyt compound hoping to get that doe. Maybe it was just bad luck but the does on this managed hunt seemed way tougher to get a shot at than the bucks so I decided to increase my range a little with the compound bow. The first morning out with the compound I filled my doe tag. I was able to make a 25 yard shot at 9:30 am on a big doe on October 29th. Glad I had the compound as 20 yards is my limit with the recurve. Also the deer was slightly quartering to me which is a shot I can make with the wheeled bow but wouldn't take with traditional equipment. Woo Hoo now I can shoot a buck! But first I had to haul the doe out on a cart about a half a mile. I spent the next day working on getting the deer meat in the freezer. I couldn't hunt again until November 6th so that only left 5 days to get my buck.



During those last 5 days I got six tree stand sits in with several close encounters including at least one Pope&Young class buck at 33 yards. The last evening of the last day found me in a tree stand tucked in close to a thick bedding area determined to take a shot at the first decent buck that came close enough. At 3:45 pm a small framed 10 point came out of the thicket on a trail that would pass by at 15 yards. When he was broadside I drew and released. The arrow hit the buck too far back for a quick kill. I knew it would kill the deer but I would have to leave him overnight to insure a recovery. I really hate it when I make a less than perfect shot but it happens and backing out when in doubt is the right thing to do. I stayed in the tree hoping for a shot at a doe as I still had a second doe permit I could fill. I did see a doe and fawn being chased by a big buck that had broken off his left side just above the brow line and a smaller 8 point buck that walked the same path the earlier 10 pointer I shot had taken. I climbed down and headed home for a long nights wait. That night it rained which turned into a light snow the next morning covering up any sign of blood from the night before. I hoped the buck didn't go far before lying down but with no trail to follow all I could do was follow the deer paths in the direction the buck had walked. I had asked my son Casey to come out and give me a hand tracking. After a quick phone call to the Longview Park Ranger Station to let them know why we were there after the hunt

had closed the day before we began to look. We quickly found the arrow showing signs of a paunch hit. Casey & I split apart about 40 yards following deer trails. Thirty minutes and 250 yards later, Casey found my buck dead. Luckily no coyotes had found him and the cold night preserved the meat. The shot was well back in the paunch just nicking the liver. It was a fatal shot but the deer was able to travel and had I tried to recover him the night before he would have run and probably escaped and become coyote food instead of my food.



I had 18 sits and spent a total of 50 hours in a tree during this hunt. I saw 71 deer, 30 bucks, 28 does, and 13 fawns. Keeping with my theme of traditional archery gear chances as compared to compound archery gear chances so far this season the tally looks like this;
Traditional Recurve Bow Chances = 5 with one shot taken and one buck kill.
Compound Bow Chances = 12 with one shot taken and one doe kill.
As you can see I felt like I've had over twice as many chances to kill deer with my compound as compared to the recurve including at least one chance at a big P&Y class 9 pointer at 33 yards. In the end it's more about what you enjoy and want to get out of your hunt. I enjoy hunting with both types of equipment but I can honestly say I feel much more deadly with my compound than my recurve bow however the challenge of the recurve has its appeal as well.
