CONSERVATION COMMITTEE REPORT

Just wanted to say thanks to the MBH President Bill Meyers and MBH Vice-President Matt Dunn!

I've been the MBH Conservation Committee Chairman since 2011 and in these past eight years I have always gotten great support from the MBH officers and B of R members to attend and represent the Missouri Bow Hunters Association at important CFM conservation conventions, meetings, MDC regulation committee, and Missouri legislative hearings. This year you're MBH President and Vice-president stepped it up a notch by actually attending some of these events with me. Back in March President Bill Myers attended the Conservation Federation of Missouri's annual convention. He attended the Archery & Shooting Sports committee meeting and the Big Game, Turkey, & Furbearers committee where we heard important updates on game populations, poaching fines increase, shooting sports programs in the Boy Scouts, the status of Chronic Wasting Disease and MDC's efforts to slow the spreading of it. Next we attended the CFM Affiliates luncheon where we talked with other outdoor organizations in our state.

This past September MBH Vice-president Matt Dunn joined me at the annual CFM Affiliate Summit. Matt and I got to spend a day & half listening to presentations about Missouri's great public lands, the importance of clean water in Missouri and the ongoing fight to keep it clean, and the legislative concerns were addressed by the CFM legislative committee. There are over 100 affiliated organizations in the Conservation Federation of Missouri totaling about 85,000 members all teaming up to promote, protect, and educate Missouri citizens about conservation in our state. Matt and I talked, ate dinner with, and told stories to several high ranking folks in the Missouri Department of Conservation including MDC Director Sarah Parker Pauley.

Now you may think all of these committee meetings, dinners, and storytelling sessions aren't very important but you would be sadly mistaken. Think of it like this, if you're neighbor comes over and asks to borrow your rake you will probably say sure since you know him by name and know where he lives but if a person from the next town who you have never seen before and have no idea where he lives asks chances are you will not agree to let them have any of your stuff. Same goes for working with like-minded conservationists within our state. By just being involved and actually talking face to face, MBH has earned the reputation of caring about Missouri's wildlife, landscape, and water which insures that The Missouri Bow Hunters Association's words and actions are an important part of Missouri Conservation and have been since our inception 72 years ago in 1947.

So keep up the good work Bill & Matt! I am thankful for your efforts to make MBH the club that every bowhunter in Missouri should support and belong to.



LARGE & SMALL GAME COMMITTEE

Man it's been a hot opening couple of weeks during the Missouri Archery Season! I have been out 3 times so far. I hunted morning and evening on September 16th. The evening hunt was especially warm with temps in the 90's and almost no wind. Only saw squirrels during the morning hunt and just a small doe fawn in the evening which did come within range but wasn't a deer I wanted to shoot. The next morning, September 17th, was again warm but at 77 it was much cooler than the evening before. The stand I sat on my Hickory County property I call the Carpet Pond Stand. Weird name huh, it got that name because there is a shallow depression that at one time held water but trees grew on the pond dam and it started leaking so the previous owners tried to seal up the pond with old carpet. It didn't work and I have since removed the carpet and now the "pond" is just a wet spot with lots of weeds but for some reason the deer like to travel through it to get to some oak acorn trees on the ridge. Back to the hunt, my son Casey had sat this stand yesterday morning and saw a small buck walk by at 30 yards around 9am. He let him pass waiting on a mature doe or bigger buck which never showed up that morning. Well Casey elected to sit in a stand in the woods this morning hoping for some acorn eating deer to wonder by so here I am in the carpet pond stand mostly because with the weather so hot I didn't want to mess up another stand with my stinky scent this early in the season. Well I was tempted not once that morning but twice, about 6:55am a mature doe walked by at 18 yards, I did get my recurve drawn and had a good quarter away angle shot but didn't take it because out of the corner of my eye I saw another deer approaching and I wanted to see what that deer was. Turned out it was another mature doe which was actually a little bigger than the first one. I also had a 20 yard shot at this doe but I again let down after drawing. I was worried about trying to get all that meat taken care of in the heat. Forecast was for another 90 degree day and butchering a deer in that weather just didn't seem like something I wanted to tackle that day. Casey also saw a doe that morning but it never gave him a shot. Anyhow I said I would keep a running count of opportunities this season comparing what I call Traditional Chances to Compound Chances. So far I have had 3 deer within 20 yards or less. I feel like 20 yards or less is a very doable Traditional Chance. Under 45 yards I'll call Compound Chances. So the score so far is; Trad Chances = 3 and Compound Chances = 3. No difference so far.
