CONSERVATION COMMITTEE REPORT

It's that time of year again when we as conservationists need to pay attention to the Missouri State Legislative session.



OPPOSE HJR 100, which poaches conservation by moving final authority over fish, forests and wildlife to the Legislature.

The Federation vigorously opposes HJR 100 which attempts to force all regulations of the Conservation Commission through a political committee (the JCAR, or "Joint Committee on Administrative Rules"). It seeks to amend the Missouri Constitution to give JCAR the authority to strike down any regulations it objects to, like those designed to protect wild deer from the disease risks of the confined big game shooting industry, or regulations designed to support the eradication of feral hogs.

It also includes deer season, turkey season, waterfowl seasons, fishing, trapping, and any other Conservation Commission regulations that have led so many wild species, including those not pursued by hunters or anglers, to thrive in Missouri.

Because the legislature cannot directly amend the Constitution, HJR 100 puts the matter on the November 2020 ballot, or "... at a special election to be called by the governor". Proponents will ask what's wrong with letting the people decide, when in truth they are just continuing their relentless attack on conservation on every front. They intend to force the conservation community to spend

time, money and energy fighting them off.

Political management of wildlife failed so totally that many species, including deer and turkey, were nearly wiped out. In 1936 Missouri voters responded by creating the Conservation Commission — giving it authority to work without oversight of the legislature. This led to Missouri's model of wildlife conservation which is the envy of the nation.

Politics must never replace science as the guiding light for the conservation of our fish, forests and wildlife. HJR 100 poses a clear threat to all we have achieved.

We need your help. It is important that your legislators hear your clear voice on HJR 100. Please act today!

There is a great tool available for **FREE** to anyone that is interested in keeping up with and evolving your opinion on Conservation items that are being proposed in the Federal and Missouri State Legislatures. The Conservation Federation of Missouri has implemented the **Legislative Action Center** which is a Web based approach for citizens to voice opinions on pending state legislation impacting conservation, natural resources and outdoor recreation. You don't need to be a CFM member to sign up and use the tool. Simply visit the CFM website at <http://confedmo.org/> and click on

Legislative Action Center



<http://www.confedmo.org/lac/> to sign up. Once you're signed up you will receive alerts informing you of legislation actions concerning conservation. The tool also lets you know who your Federal and State representatives and senators are and how to contact them via phone or email. The site also will provide you with scientific data and facts, so you may participate as an informed citizen about how to best manage the natural resources of our state. You can vote for or against the pending legislation to let your representative know your position. Make sure to let your legislators know how you feel about each one of these bills.

- 16. Alan Boesch**, Rolla, shot a 50 lb. Button Buck on New Year's Day at 8:35 am with a 20 yard shot in Perry County. Archery deer # 73 in 55 years of bowhunting and fifth kill this season for Allan.
- 17. Alan Boesch**, Rolla, shot a 89 lb. Doe on 1/13/20 at 8:05 am with a 30 yard shot in Perry County. Archery deer #74 in 55 years of bowhunting and sixth kill this season for Allan.

Well another archery season has ended, hope your season was successful whether you filled a tag or not and you are planning for next year's adventures. Now is a great time of year to dream and plan about out of state hunts. Pick and adventure and start your research on the internet or go to one of the great "Outdoor Shows" that happen every year about this time. I have been on a hand full of guided hunts and I can honestly say I've enjoyed everyone for the experience. Each trip had its own unique feel and lasting memories were made on each one. I must say that to truly get your monies worth" in my opinion you need to enjoy the chase, especially using archery gear. Your chances of a successful harvest are always slim when using a bow and arrow. Seeing new country and wild places are what draws me to new adventures. Of course I would like kill whatever critter I'm after and once in a while I do but that's icing on the cake for me. I'm still pretty healthy and try to stay active enough to maintain my health and mobility. It takes some work and dedication to get up and go exercise at least three days a week but the benefits are real. You may only want to spend more years helping your grandchildren learn to hunt and fish but you can't do that if you ain't here. Late January and February are especially hard to stay active in. It's just so nice to stay in by the fire and read or watch TV. To motivate myself I start dreaming of next fall's adventure and working towards that goal. Here's one more tip. I have found that the best guided trips I've been on were with well know outfitters that have been in business for several years. That's not saying that there aren't great hunts provided by new outfitters in new areas and if you have a friend who knows from personal experience that it's a great trip then by all means go for it. Otherwise stay with the tried and true. That said booking with a well know outfitter will probably have to be at least 2 years before you want to go so you can get the dates and licenses you'll need. It also gives you two years to pay for it and get in shape. DIY hunts are another option but personally I would rather save money for a guided hunt in an area with an outfitter that knows the area and the animals I'm after. I enjoy seeing new regions and new country and to be a successful DIY bowhunter I feel like you need to pick a spot and learn how to hunt that area by making several trips to the same place. Nothing wrong with that I would just rather do it differently. I also know my time of climbing mountains and riding horseback for several hours is coming to an end probably within the next 5 years so next month we'll take about "Old-Timers" Bowhunts. Stay tuned.
