Etiquette of Indoor Archery



With the Indoor season just around the corner this would be a good time to refresh ourselves with some indoor archery etiquette/rules.

- Archers must conduct himself/herself at all times in a manner that will bring respect and honor to himself/herself, and the archery club or organization they represent..
- Archers shall make every effort to comply with all rules and regulations both published and intended.
- Obscene or vulgar slogans or pictures on clothing are not acceptable.
- Do not touch anyone else's equipment without permission.
- Archers should be able to pull their bow back without pointing higher than the height of their target butt.
- Verbal communication between shooter and any spectators while on the shooting line is not permitted.
- Listen for the whistle or voice command to approach the line, start and/or stop shooting.
- Keep your arrows in your quiver until range is clear.
- Archers must straddle the shooting line.
- Always check archers on either side of you before entering and leaving the line. <u>Do not leave or enter the line when an archer is at full draw.</u> Leave the line only if finished shooting or you experience a malfunction.
- If you experience a equipment malfunction, notify a line judge by rising your hand.
- When finished shooting all your arrows, step back from the line and place your bow on the bow rack and wait behind the bow rack.
- Walk (don't run) when going to score and returning with pulled arrows.
- Parents of cubs who have knowledge of how the targets are scored are invited to help with the scoring but may not help score on the target butt that their child is shooting on. If you would like to help, please notify either the President, Secretary or the person in charge of guardian angels. Not every parent will be allowed to go down range. This only adds to the confusion and delays the scoring process.
- Parent (s) of youth and young adults are not allowed to help with the scoring.
- If arrows become difficult to score (due to target being shot up) the line judge will require you to replace that target.

PASSING OF THE LEGENDARY BOWHUNTER/ARCHER/MOUNTAIN MAN/EDUCATOR/FRIEND

A sincere tribute to the man who accomplished so much

You didn't know our Don Roper was a Godly, humble, helping, generous loving sensitive, charismatic man. No matter how thick the beard, it could not conceal that infectious smile.

Don and I met nearly 60 years ago wearing hip-waders and dodging cottonmouths at Duck Creek and then Mingo Swamps. I never asked, but trulu felt that Don had each one of those venomous residents named. Don lived in Wayne County and knew that country like the back of his hand.

Don A.K.A. Mountain man, loved the mountains of Montana and bowhunting with family and friends and tested out his new knee there for three (3) weeks this summer.

Don was educated and was a fabulous educator. He held a Business Degree from Maryville College and a Masters from National University. At the time of his retirement from Missouri State Employment, he was Superintendent of the Potosi Correction Center. Ademanding task requiring one with special gifts.

Without a doubt, Don was the father of bowhunter Education in Missouri. He also served as Vice-President of Missouri Bowhunters. While Ken Perry was President, Don would set up regional Bowhunter "clinics" and the three of us would sometimes have 30-40 folks in attendance. Early on, Don embraced the national Bowhunter Education Program that gained traction in those years, amd made it flourish in Missouri. Thousands of folksgot to meet Don in his volunteer education mode. Don was one of the founding members and Past President of the Archery Big Bucks of Missouri. Don was a certified Pope & Young and Boone & Crockett measurer. Steve Lenz, retired Conservation Agent in Jefferson County, commented after hearing Don's passing, "That man measured a zillion racks!!'. Steve was right on! Don's time/miles on car/gas in tank were "Generous" not descriptive enough.

Not to be forgotten, are the tremendous efforts and energy, with Claudette (wife) as a partner, that made all of those highly successful Mo. Deer Classic's held in Columbia, a "Mark Your Calendar" event for years. They alone, had the talent. Don served MBH as Big & Small Game Chariman for over 12 years, as well as being a Board member.

Don is one of only four MBH members to hit the "Tricecta" of Honor, by being awarded the "Pauline Reeg Award", "The Lifetime MBH Member" and the MBH hall of Fame".

No doubt that Don would feel highly honored and please for all who are moved with his contributions and support of these various organizations—those that relate to Go's great poutdoors, consider following Don's lead by joining/supporting, volunteering for one or more of these groups. More importantly, Don would stress that if you love the outdoors and God's creation, that you love and worship the creator. I personally look forward to that "Hot Spot" where Don already has a treestand in Place for me.

Donald Pratt Roper, 75, of Newark, Missouri, passed away August 14, 2022 at the Harry S. Truman Memorial Veterans Hospital in Columbia.

Donald was born on September 5, 1946 in Bloomfield, Missouri a son of Hershel Wendell and Bessie Linville Roper. He served his nation in the U.S. Army during the Vietnam War entering in June 1966 and was honorably discharged in May 1969. LARGE & SMALL GAME COMMITTEE

It's the third evening of my Wyoming Whitetail hunt and I've just spotted the best buck I've seen so far. He's a respectable 10pt and if he gives me a shot I'm gonna take it.

This hunt has been a journey in motivation and physical therapy. Let me explain a little. I have been battling a sore hip for awhile now and last January I finally decided to take the advice of my doctors and schedule a left hip replacement. The surgery was scheduled for March, so I figured I'd set a goal of being back in a treestand by the fall and what better motivation than to book an Archery Whitetail Hunt with Seven J Outfitters in Sundance, Wyoming! What I didn't know was that my surgery would be postponed until August 30th. My Wyoming Whitetail Hunt started on September 22nd only three weeks after the surgery. I've always wanted to try whitetail hunting out west and since I'd been elk hunting with Seven J previously, I knew the operation and knew they would do everything they could to make it a good hunt. Like most things in life, I've found that it's better to pay a little more for a quality product or experience than to try and save a buck or two on something cheaper.

The operation went well, and I started what I hoped would be a quick recovery, however things didn't go as quickly as I wanted. Turns out that I did too much therapy exercising on my own which caused some extra swelling and pain which I wasn't too happy about. When I finally conceded that maybe I should slow down and let it heal some before working the hell out of it things began to turn around. By September 20th with the help of my always supportive wife Kim we were packed and heading to Wyoming. You're probably wondering how I got the doctor to approve letting me walk uneven terrain and climb into a treestand? That was easy because I didn't ask for approval I just went! I'll ask forgiveness later.

Back to the hunt, that 10pt was the 33rd deer that had been by my stand in the last three hours. That's one of the cool things about hunting Wyoming. If you're in the right place you can expect to see A LOT of deer heading to the green fields from the Black Hills National Forest bedding areas to the irrigated green fields below. Sitting in a big old pine tree swaying with the wind while listening to elk bugle and watching whitetails parade by your stand is something I will always remember. My guide Lane had dropped me off about 200 yards from my treestand that evening and using a hiking stick for a little extra support I walked uphill and climbed into my stand about 4pm. I had passed shots at a couple of decent 8 pointers and seen lots of does close but now it was 6:45pm with about thirty minutes of daylight left and the buck was heading my way. He was following a smaller buck which ended up walking directly under my stand. The smaller buck walked by, and the target buck followed. When the 10 point was in a position, I thought was good for a shot I grunted to stop him but instead of stopping he jumped and ran a few steps. He was now broadside at 25 yards but there was now a tree limb blocking part of the buck's chest. I had to bend my knees some to a squatting position to get a clear shot. My left leg is still weak and believe me when I say that squat was very challenging. I released the arrow and heard a satisfying thwap! I was able to watch the buck bed down at about 100 yards however his head was still up, and my shot appeared to be a little low. I climbed down and when in doubt back out! I spent a sleepless night replaying everything I observed before, during and after the shot. I was confident that we would find the buck the next morning dead where I had last seen him lay down.

Sunday morning September 25th My guide Lane, my wife Kim and myself went back searching at daylight. I was worried when the buck wasn't where I had last seen him. We did find several beds with dark blood in them but no deer. My arrow showed darker liver blood, so we knew the buck

had to be dead somewhere we just had to find it. We noticed very fresh elk sign in the area, so Lane thought maybe an elk herd had bumped my buck from his bed during the night causing him to travel a little further. It took a little while, but we spread out and Lane found my buck about 100 yards further down the trail. What a relief, my shot was low and a little back only cutting the liver.

The decision to back out and leave the deer overnight was a good call and remember just because you don't find the deer quickly never give up looking especially if you know the shot was lethal. I must thank 7J Outfitters and my wife Kim for all their help and support during my "physical therapy".
