Missouri Bow Hunter Hall of Fame By: Bill Myers

Hall of Fame Chairman

Many of our members are not aware that the MBH has a Hall of Fame. The ideal of a Hall of Fame was presented to the Board of Representatives at one of the state outdoor championships by Dick Wood. His goal and ours to this day is to have a place to showcase and honor the MBH Hall of Fame inductees.

Past recipients have been Paul Jeffries (co-founder of MBH), Earl Hoyt (co-founder of MBH), Ann Hoyt and Gene Towne, Earl and Millie Foster, Don Roper, Dick Wood ,Frank Tolivar and Butch Harold.

So, what is the criteria for consideration and how is one elected into the Hall of Fame. The Hall of Fame was formed to honor those MBH individuals who exhibited by their deeds, leadership and effect on archery in any or all of its forms that makes them stand out among their peers. The inductee into MBH Hall of Fame must be an MBH for at least 10 years. The Hall of Fame Committee is made up of the Chairman and all lifetime members. The committee submits names for consideration to the Board of Representatives at the January meeting and they are voted on at that time by the Board.

If you know of some one whom you think deserves this recognition any MBH member may be a sponsor. As a sponsor you will need to submit a name of the individual along with a detailed resume to the Chairman or one of the lifetime members. All nominations will be held in the strictest confidence of the committee and will be presented to the Board of Representatives at the January Board meeting and voted on. The results of the vote will not be given out except to notify the sponsor if the individual has or has not been elected.

Inductee's will be officially inducted into the Hall of Fame at the State Indoor Championships. Photos, along with an article will be published in the MBH Release.



CONSERVATION COMMITTEE REPORT



Missouri will have its third Elk season in 2022. The 2021 elk season recorded what it calls Missouri's first archery elk kill on October 18th, 2021. What is not being very well publicized is that it was shot with a crossbow. I know MDC classifies as archery equipment, but I disagree.

12 Black Bears harvested during Missouri's first bear season, all gun kills.

Archery Deer Season checked 59,498 deer harvested in 2021, down from last year's record kill of over 67,000. License sales were about the same as 2020 however over half of the archery kill was with crossbows in 2021. So it appears that license sales have leveled off but more and more hunters are using crossbows during the archery season.

Youth Archery Hunters are now exempt from the antler-point restriction statewide. This was a rule change proposed by the Conservation Federation of Missouri Archery Committee back in 2019. It took a while but finally was approved for this year.

CWD testing will again be mandatory in all cwd zone counties during the opening weekend of firearms deer season in 2022. There are also several drop off freezers available this fall to get your deer tested. You can find these locations at Voluntary CWD Sampling | Missouri Department of Conservation (mo.gov) Again this year 4 new counties were added to the CWD management zone. Those new counties for 2022 are Barton, Greene, Ripley, and Vernon counties all in southern Missouri. There are now 38 counties included in the cwd zones across Missouri now. Bottom line is that CWD is still very rare but is expanding slowly and Missouri is doing a fairly good job of slowing the spread.

 - 1. State Indoor Jim Akers will look into hosting sites in Columbia area. If someone submits a bid to move the tournament to 1 location the board will discuss and vote on the bid. Otherwise it will remain virtual with the same hosting sites as previous year.

Same locations as last year. Medals awarded.
 - B. MBH 450 Shoot Dec. 3-4, 2022. Shooter only shoots 1 450 round. Hosting locations can offer 1 day or 2 days to accommodate all the shooters. \$25 entry fee; \$10 per shooter for hosting fees; register through MBH but call location to get shooting times. Same locations as last year. Medals awarded.
- 3. MBH needs bids for the State 600; State Outdoor Field; and State 3D for 2023. Any MBH club interested in submitting a bid can send them to the MBH secretary for board's approval.

- 4. Conservation Federation gave MBH a \$500 grant to use for the youth shooters. Any youth shooter who registers and shoots in the MBH Youth tournament in November will be entered into a raffle. 5 shooters will be randomly drawn to receive a \$100 gift certificate to use at an archery shop of their choice. The drawing will be held on Sunday night, Nov. 20th after all scores are turned in.

From the President:

I have been reflecting on the state of the Missouri Bowhunters Association (MBH) lately. The MBH I knew back when I first joined is most definitely not the MBH of today. Back in the early 80's MBH had a membership in the high hundreds. One of the big reasons for this was when you joined an archery club you became a club member and a MBH member. Some of the club membership fee went to your MBH membership. Every club, whether the club was a target club or a bowhunter club they all supported MBH (Joining NFAA was an option).

I believe archery clubs were more round back then, except for a few, every club had a field range. If they didn't, they at least had a bowhunter range. They may not have had an indoor range but generally one was close by. There was a field shot or animal (paper targets and unknown) almost every weekend. Clubs supported all aspects of archery (indoor target, indoor animal rounds, field, and outdoor animal) whereas clubs today have become focused on only one aspect, mostly 3D. Sadly, Missouri has lost several indoor ranges/pro shops (it's a hard business to make money) and several clubs have been disbanded.

Today MBH is down in membership and clubs chartered with MBH (NFAA). I know what you are going to say, "What does MBH do for me?". I can throw that same question back to the clubs. The state organization is only as good or strong as its clubs and membership. So, my answer is, MBH has been involved in the 30 minutes before sunrise/sunset regulation, two deer/two turkey archery tags, and Share the Harvest program. The founding members pushed for the first archery deer season. Today MBH is a proud member of the Conservation Federation of Missouri (CFM). For years we chaired the archery committee (which is now called the Outdoor Shooting Sports). Our small/large game chair keeps track of any changes to the hunting regulations (archery/guns) and goes before the State, MDC and provide the pro and cons of such regulation changes.

So, what does this all mean you say. If the general membership does not become more involved in the day-to-day operations, sadly MBH will fade into the night. That means no more State Tournaments and no State Archery Organization fighting for your archery rights. Some of us are getting old/older. I have been involved in the MBH Board of Directors since the mid 80's either as a club director or serving as an officer of the Board. It is time for younger members to become involved and lead this organization into the future. I don't have all the answers and you may not either, but you can provide new suggestions and leadership.
