TIME TO GET SERIOUS!!!!

Serious about practicing for the upcoming archery season that is.

I know there are still lots of 3D tournaments being held in August and you can continue to shoot those but do it with the same equipment that you will be hunting with this fall. If you have a target bow that you have been shooting all summer with lightweight arrows its time to put that away and start shooting your hunting setup. In my case that means putting the quiver on my bow, filling it with arrows, switching my arrows from the 350 grain target arrows to my Easton Axis with 125 grain heads that weigh in at 460 total grains, and really, really concentrating on that very first shot!

In most hunting scenarios you only get one chance so practice making that one shot count. I like to shoot at least twice a week of 30 to 50 arrows mostly to keep my muscles in shape so I can continue to pull 55 to 60 pounds draw weight. But my hunting scenario practice happens at least three times a week beginning in August and consists of shooting one arrow at my 3D deer target usually from 50 or 60 yards. I feel like it's important to emphasize that first shot and do it at a 3D target with no spot on the side of it for an aiming point. Fifty plus yards is a long shot especially for Missouri Whitetails but if you can make that first arrow a kill shot at fifty yards then a twenty-to-thirty-yard shot seems easy. Also, if you get the chance to hunt game out west like Pronghorn or Elk, you're ready to make a longer shot. Another practice drill I like to use is to shoot one arrow at 60, one at 55, one at 50, one at 45, one at 40, and finally one arrow at 35 yards at the 3D target. Then take a photo of your group. Do that over several days of practice and then compare photos. Are you improving your groups? Just have fun with practice but do it with a mindset of making a perfect first shot when it counts the most.

Happy Bow Hunt'in, Jeff Blystone Ireland. Youth World Championships.

Hello, my name is Leann Drake, 17 years of age from Lexington Mo. Back in April 2023 I qualified 3rd for U18 compound female. As I continued shooting the USAT's and preparing hard for the Youth World Championships, I arrived in Ireland, July 1st. It was time to start practicing and getting used to the weather and new surroundings. The weather was like nothing I had shot in before. Rain every hour for about 20 minutes, and colder weather than I'm used to.

On Tuesday we shot qualification, wind like never before, rain and cold weather. After struggling and shooting a low score I ended in 12th. Although I didn't shoot high enough to make mixed teams, I was able to practice and prepare for teams. Liko Arreola, Olivia Dean, and myself were able to shoot high enough through the elimination matches to make it to the gold medal match against India. The wind was tough, but us three girls were able to bring home the silver medal as a team.

Moving on, after shooting the qualification match I had to work my way through 4 shooters from all around the world to reserve my spot in the gold medal match. I shot strong and hard. It was time for the gold medal match on the big stage. As I walked out on the field of play I knew I was ready, this is what I had trained and prepared so hard for. I shot against the U18 compound female world record holder from India. The wind was a little different than expected, between the tents and canopies. I fell behind in the first end, I then started to find my groove and was working my way back, but it was too late. Although I wish I could get a few shots back, I was still able to bring home another silver from my very first out of country tournament. I am now ranked number two in the world, in the U18 compound female division.

Ever since I was a young girl, I always dreamed of shooting on the big stage. Now I get to wear the USA jersey with a smile on my face after bringing home two silver medals from my very first Youth World Championships out of the country. Overall it was a great opportunity and another door that was able to be opened.

Hi Bill,

I am reaching out to you today to ask about donations of deer or other native species for the Saint Louis Zoo's American red wolf breeding center in Franklin County. I know there are bow hunters that already donate to our good friends and partners at the Endangered Wolf Center but thought we would check with MBH as well. Maybe due to county line restrictions and CWD there are people who couldn't transport their deer to St. Louis County and the Endangered Wolf Center but could work with us out here in Franklin County.

The American red wolf is critically endangered and are part of a reintroduction program in North Carolina. This newly developed branch of the Saint Louis Zoo is closed to the public and we limit our time around the wolves so they are good release candidates for the wild. We especially want to feed them their native diet of deer, rabbits, turkey, and squirrels as another way to prepare them to go to the wild. My colleagues and I would love to present to you or your association to explain our request in further detail, if you're interested.
