LARGE & SMALL GAME COMMITTEE

The Arby's restaurant saying goes "WE HAVE THE MEAT!" and that applies to our family this year as we were blessed to harvest several deer this season to stock our freezers. I started it off with an archery buck kill in Wyoming the third week of September. I was successful again the first week of November in Missouri with another nice buck. Next Missouri rifle season opened and my son got an opening day buck, my wife Kim shot a nice 8 point the following Thursday morning. I also arrowed a doe that same evening. The next day my 80-year-old father-in-law shot a good 8 pointer as well. I'm not bragging, well maybe I am a little bit. I don't ever remember a year when all four hunting members of our family killed bucks, so I thought that was cool.

What I'd like to get across in this article is the point that lean, fresh, healthy venison is walking around in Missouri and can fill your freezer too. With the price of meat at the grocery going sky high I know that our family would be eating less meat but also red meat from the store that's not nearly as good for you as fresh, wild, & lean deer meat. We do most of the processing of our deer ourselves or donate deer whole to other family members and friends or Share the Harvest. Yes you will need to buy some stuff to process your deer at home but aside from knives, plastic bags or plastic wrap and freezer paper, the most expensive thing is a quality meat grinder. Even those can be bought at Bass Pro Shops for two to three hundred dollars for a good one. We add 70/30 or 80/20 ground beef to our venison at a ratio of 1 lb. beef to 5 lbs. venison to get it to cook and hold together better for burgers on the grill. When you consider that ground beef is selling for \$3.99 a pound and will probably go higher you can pay for that grinder in a couple of years while having the knowledge and satisfaction of knowing your eating healthier and cheaper. Sure, it takes some work to skin, cut up, and package your deer but it's very worth it in my opinion. Heck even if you don't want to do all that hands on work you can take your deer to one of Missouri's many deer processors, drop it off and pick it up a couple of weeks later all frozen and packaged while still paying less and eating healthier red meat than you would pay at the grocer. This year I wanted some summer sausage from my favorite source made from venison. I dropped my Missouri archery buck off at Nadler's Meats in Wellington, MO. The nice 9 pointer field dressed at 186 lbs. I asked for my back straps to be saved and sliced with the rest of the deer made into 1 lb. burger packages with beef added and three different flavors of summer sausage or snack sticks.

A couple of weeks later I picked up 127 pounds of venison all frozen and packaged expertly for my freezer at a total cost of \$360.94. That sounds like a lot of money for processing and I'm sure there are shops that would do it cheaper, but I got burger, back strap steaks, and summer sausage at an average cost of \$2.85 per pound. You can't get red meat at the grocery store for that price right now. So get out there and harvest some premium red meat and next year you can say "**We Have The Meat**".

CONSERVATION COMMITTEE REPORT

Some changes are coming to next year's Missouri deer season. Last month MDC Commissioner's approved the regulations for the 2023 deer seasons and here's what's new.

A new Early Firearms Antlerless Season will happen October 6 – 8, 2023. This is what MDC says was the reasoning. "The early antlerless portion will provide additional hunting opportunities and help increase antlerless deer harvest prior to the November portion of firearms season, when many hunters focus on harvesting bucks. Timing of the early antlerless portion was designed to occur when weather conditions are generally favorable and during a time that will minimize conflict with archery hunters, who usually hunt most in late October and early November."

The problem is there are fewer hunters and the deer herd in Missouri is increasing in most of the state so to deal with that MDC hopes by having an early firearms season the can reduce the overall deer population. Same thing goes for the other regulation changes which will increase the number of antlerless permits as well as making the rifle season longer in all CWD designated counties.

As primarily a bowhunter I don't really like firearms hunters in the woods when I'm bowhunting but I understand the need to manage the herd to prevent things like-car-deer collisions, crop damage, and the spread of diseases like CWD and EHD. It also means we will be wearing the hunter orange for a few more days of archery season. Archery season is still the same length as in the past from September 15 to November 10 and reopens on November 22 until January 15 but you may hear a few more gun shots next year. Also, congratulations to Joe Miller for harvesting a Missouri Elk with his bow this past October. Joe was the first to kill a Missouri Elk with a vertical or real bow as opposed to last year's crossbow kill.




