There is one big change this year as far as national membership. As of the 1st NFAA no longer will accept US Archery membership at its tournaments. One must now be a NFAA member to shoot a NFAA tournament. I am not sure what the US Archery requirements are now but I would assume the same.

The Midwest Indoor Sectionals will be held February 24-25, 2024 at several locations (Iowa, Nebraska, Yankton, Kansas and Minn.). Hope to see a few of you in Wichita. The MBH indoor will once again be held at the IBH indoor range in Raytown, MO. It will be a two day tournament with Saturday being a 360 using the NFAA indoor target and Sunday will be a Vegas 330 using the Yellow Vegas target.



Dennis Roy Ballard (1941-2024)



Dennis Roy Ballard, 82, of
Sturgeon, Missouri, passed away
peacefully on January 3rd, 2024.
His wife of 63 years, Rita Kay
Ballard, was at his side. Born
November 1, 1941, to Mervin
"Buck" Ballard and Dorothy
Ballard of Red Oak, Iowa, Dennis
graduated from Red Oak High
School in 1959, and continued his
education at the University of
Iowa, graduating in 1965.

Dennis is survived by his wife Rita

and their three children: Mark Ballard of Columbia, Missouri; Scott and Rhonda Ballard of Gainesville, Georgia; and Carey Ballard of Bisbee, Arizona. Also surviving are six grandchildren and one great grandson: Emma Scheiderer of Springfield, Missouri, Lindsay Ballard of Atlanta, Georgia; Eric Ballard of Tuscaloosa, Alabama; Kelli Ann Ballard of Kennesaw, Georgia; Brandon and Danielle Ballard of Gainesville, Georgia; and son of Emma Scheiderer, Benny Scheiderer of Springfield, Missouri.

In addition to being a dedicated, loving, and compassionate life partner to Rita, a fully committed role model to his children, and a warm, kind and generous grandfather, Dennis' love for the outdoors, the art and science of archery, and the sport of bow hunting knew no bounds. As a life-long hunter and fisherman, Dennis published his first

article in *Archery Magazine* in 1970 and, over the next 60 years, published more than 100 articles and columns, all sharing his passion for archery, bowhunting and the Great Outdoors. Most notably, Dennis authored the very first widely published review of the compound bow and helped to propel a revolution in the archery industry while bringing a new generation of archers and bow hunters into the heritage and joy of archery.

Following a highly successful career with the Department of Veterans Affairs, where he supported clinical research critical to the health and wellness of Veterans, Dennis served as Executive Director of the Conservation Federation of Missouri, whose mission is 'to ensure the conservation of Missouri's wildlife and natural resources and the preservation of (Missouri's) rich outdoor heritage...' In this role, Dennis represented thousands of 'citizen conservationists' throughout the state, working with them to enhance Missouri's natural resources through state and national-level initiatives and giving them a voice before the Missouri General Assembly and the Missouri Departments of Conservation and Natural Resources.

Dennis' list of accolades, achievements, and recognitions is extensive, including but not limited to:

- 1993 Conservationist of the Year (Conservation Federation of Missouri)
- 1994 G. Andy Runge Award (Missouri Chapter The Wildlife Society)
- 1996 Master Conservationist (Missouri Conservation Commission)
- 2007 Conservation Award (Pope and Young Club)
- 2011 "Safari" a one-man stage performance showcasing Dr. Saxton Pope at the Pope & Young club's 50th anniversary convention.

Among his many contributions, none will be as lasting and impactful as Missouri's 'Share the Harvest Program,' for which Dennis is credited. Share the Harvest is a hunter-led program designed to share surplus venison with Missourians in need. Signed into law by Governor Mel Carnahan in 1993, the program provides nearly 250,000 pounds of venison each year, totaling over five million pounds since the program's inception. A lifelong ambassador for wildlife conservation, archery, and the sport of bow hunting, Dennis' contributions will remain impactful for many generations to come, he will indeed be missed.

As a tribute to a great Missouri Conservationist and Bowhunter who just recently passed away at the age of 82, I thought I would publish the last Large Game Report that was I could find in the records from Denny Ballard. Denny killed a 9-point buck on 11-1-2003 at the age of 62. Happy Heavenly Bow Hunt'in Denny!
